## SCREEN REVIEW

"The Mighty Barnum" starring Wallace Beery, opened before an enthusiastic house last night at the Craterian, for a decidedly novel and entertaining picture, jammed with the wild events of the hectic career of the master showman of all American history.

The picture moves swiftly, the scene being laid in New York a hundred years ago. The beginning of the peculiar twist in the Barnum nature which attracted his imagination to the outlandish and bizarre freaks that later made several fortunes, is portrayed, and from that point forward there isn't a dull moment.

Beery carries the role to perfection. Barnum is shown as a good-natured but blundering genius with a knack of putting on shows that the people will pay to see, and a large collection of interesting freaks help make the picture authentic. Adolph Menjou again scores a hit.

## Bob Steele Coming to Roxy



Fact and fiction are closely intermingled in the Bob Steele western, "Son of Oklahoma," which comes to the Roxy theater tomorrow. A major part of the story is laid around a gold mine, hidden far out in the desert, the location of it being known only to the owner and his immediate family.
