

### INTERPLEADER SUIT OF NIEDERMAYER TO BE ARGUED MONDAY

The interpleader suit of Niedermeyer, Inc., for apportionment of an award against them in favor of E. H. Fehl, his wife, Electa A. Fehl, and Corintha E. Stanley will be heard in circuit court Monday before Circuit Judge Carl Wimberly of Douglas county.

Matters to be determined at the hearing include:

Adjudication of the claim of Kelly & Kelly and Attorney T. J. Truight. Kelly & Kelly ask \$2000 for defense of Fehl in the original suit, preparation of an appeal brief and argument before the supreme court. Fehl, in an answer, asserts that he gave no authorization for the legal move. Attorney Truight claims \$500 for legal services rendered, including assisting in the defense of Fehl at his trial in Klamath Falls for vote stealing. Fehl, in his answer, sets forth that \$100 is a sufficient fee.

Action of Ted Helmroth of Griffen Creek and J. B. Thomas of Ashland, who came to the financial rescue of Fehl to the extent of a \$5400 loan, to enable Fehl to purchase the Pacific Record-Herald building at a sheriff's sale to quiet title to the building.

Claims of Jackson county for back taxes against Fehl amounting to approximately \$100.

### GARLE TO RECEIVE \$711 FOR TURKEYS

An order entitling F. E. Garle, Valley View district poultry raiser, to \$711.27 held by the sheriff's office unless Mrs. Gertrude Ottinger takes steps to indemnify the sheriff, has been signed by Circuit Judge H. D. Norton. The money has been held by the sheriff and was received for the sale of turkeys. The action is another chapter in the suit of Gertrude Ottinger against Garle, his wife, Alice Garle, and LaMuel Stevens for damages for shooting and killing of the Ottinger dog last fall. The jury returned a verdict in favor of Mrs. Ottinger against Stevens and Mrs. Garle but not against Garle.

Testimony in the trial purported to show that the dog had been slain while raiding the Garle poultry yard.

### SECOND-HAND CAR TITLE IMPERFECT

Charley Wilson of Dorris, Cal., was fined \$5 and costs in Justice of the Peace W. R. Coleman's court for improper license plates. The fine was suspended by the court pending adjustment of Wilson's title to the auto. It developed that he had purchased a second-hand auto from a Klamath Falls dealer and received in imperfect title. Wilson was instructed to report to the state police in Klamath Falls, who will assist him in straightening out the tangle.

Ivan Crum, Medford student at Oregon State college at Corvallis, was fined \$5 and costs for no license plates. The case has been pending since January 1. The fine was suspended.

### SAWMILL PAYROLL SETTLING LOOMS

Prospect of settlement of wage claims of 20 Ashland workers against S. L. Damsard, Dead Indian sawmill operator, loomed today, the district attorney's office reported. Damsard, held in the county jail on two charges alleging failure to maintain a monthly payroll and larceny by false check, notified the district attorney that he had made arrangements for turning over \$852 said to have been retained for sale of lumber in Sacramento, Cal. It was alleged that this sum was not turned over to the workers as promised, but to Damsard's son. The claims run from \$25 to \$125. The claimants, all Ashland district residents, are represented by Attorney William Briggs.

Word has been received in Medford of the death of Sidney George Hopkins, 38, in Hartford, Conn. 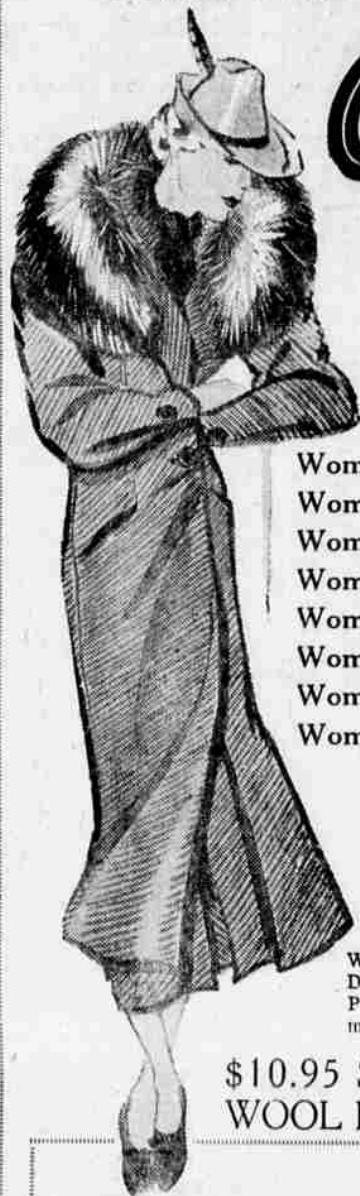
