NEW LIQUOR BOARD TO CHART COURSE IN SATURDAY MEET

SALEM, Feb. 1.—(AP)—Given a free hand by Governor Charles H. Martin to reorganize and carry on as it deems best, a revamped state liquor commission will hold its initial meeting in Portland Saturday to formulate policies, outline a program of administration of the liquor control law and study the set-up it has inherited and decide upon an administrative personnel.

By appointments announced yesterday by the governor, Arthur K. McMahon, Albany attorney and former democratic member of the legislature, will preside as chairman, and Stanley G. Jewett, Lloyd's agent and general insurance man of Portland, will sit as one commissioner, James Burns of Condon, incumbent democrat, is the third member of the board.

One thing upon which everyone is all in touch with the situation agrees is that one of the first actions of the board will be to accept the resignation of administrator.

Another cause of speculation concerns what the commission will do relative to selecting a successor to George Neuner, who has been attorney for the board since its organization and who says he is ready and anxious to quit.

PARTIAL ECLIPSE SUNDAY MORNING

EUGENE.—(Spl.)—A partial eclipse of the sun, beginning at 7:45 a. m., and extending for an hour, will be visible from Pacific coast points on Friday, February 2, according to Hugo Frost, astronomy instructor of the extension division of the University of Oregon.

This is the third event on the eclipse program for this unusual year, during which seven eclipses may be seen. This is the greatest number possible in one year, and such a maximum year generally occurs only once in a century. The 20th century will be gifted with three such years, 1917, 1935 and 1982.

For those who will find themselves out of bed so early on Sunday morning a good view of the phenomena may be obtained by squinting through a bit of smoked glass, or a piece of dark photographic film. A warning is issued that it is dangerous to look directly at the sun through a telescope or field glass, as permanent damage may result to the eyes.
