SPRING FASHIONS IN EVENING DRESS ALIVE WITH COLOR

Color and Glitter Featured in Clothes Designed for Early Wear — Satins, Crepes and Chiffons Are Used

PARIS. —(AP)—Color and glitter enliven the new evening clothes which Paris has designed for early spring wear. Though both vivid hues and sparkle appear in accents rather than in the body of the gown, there is many a bright and novel touch to spell "1935."

Pigskin belts on evening frocks, huge chrysanthemums dripping from waistlines, turquoise buttons and glass fabric tunics are among the effects which make the style scout "stop, look and listen."

Pigskin for Evening
Molyneux adds a natural pigskin belt and gloves—of all things—to a black velvet evening frock and great, vivid long-petaled chrysanthemums to the waistlines of crepe evening gowns. Many of them are worn with little jackets dripping with gold or tortoiseshell paillettes.

Turquoise clips and buttons are Lelong's favorite accent for white satin or black velvet evening gowns. Most of them are made of tiny turquoise beads closely clustered in gold or silver, one of the most striking effects being achieved by a row of turquoise buttons on a black gown.

Clips and Clasps Used
Lanvin puts big crystal or rhinestone clips in the corners of square evening décolletés, while Patou uses emerald or ruby clips to repeat the color of stones which appear in big splashing belt clasps.

The same designer finds a new way of adding color by lining the panel trains of his new evening gowns with a contrasting shade.

Shiaporelli does things in her own way. She uses a shimmering fabric said to be woven with spun glass, for the crushed belts and tunics which appear with her night-time frocks, and sometimes adds a saucy little bow of contrasting shade in the back waistline where fluffiness is concentrated.

One of her most striking frocks is a taffeta model in a new shade called Chinese ink (rich blue black) which has a diamond-shaped apron of pink "glass" fabric with the top point held to the neck by a garland of pink gardenias.

Another of water green satin is designed with the skirt fullness all swept to the back and topped at the point where it is shirred by a little red velvet bow.

Rough shinning satins, blistered crepes and chiffons are the fabrics most often used, while turquoise, pink, tea yellow, vanilla, soft greens, plum, brown, black and white are colors most often favored.



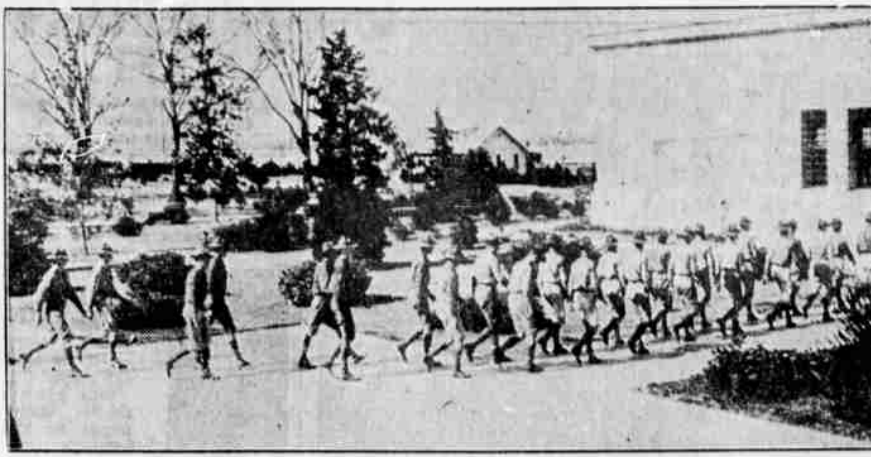

625 HUNGER STRIKERS FLOCK FROM MINE PIT

PECS, Hungary, Feb. 1.—(AP)—Exhaustion from hunger and cold after 35 hours of self-imposed imprisonment in the dark depths of a coal mine, the remaining 625 hunger-striking miners who went below ground yesterday emerged from the pits at 3:30 p. m. today and declared themselves ready to negotiate with the mine owners.

The exit of the 625 cleared the pits of strikers for 73 of the number who went below ground previously and emerged.

RAILROAD SERVICE FOR 40 PASSENGERS COSTLY

CHICAGO, Feb. 1.—(UP)—The Grand Trunk railroad told the Illinois commerce commission today that

its round trip service between Chicago and Harvey, with a daily average of 40 passengers, was so expensive the road could provide an automobile for each passenger and lose less money at the end of the year.

LEGAL BLACKMAIL WOULD BE BARRED BY WOMAN SOLON

INDIANAPOLIS, Feb. 1.—(AP)—Indiana's only woman legislator—Mrs. Robert West Nicholson of Indianapolis—today won her first skirmish to bar suits for alienation of affection, breach of promise, seduction and naming of co-respondents in divorce proceedings when the house passed her bill by a vote of 87 to 7. The bill now goes to the senate.

Referring to suits for alienation of affection, breach of promise and seduction, Mrs. Nicholson, in her second speech of the session, said: "As every attorney in this assembly knows, such suits which enable a woman to capitalize on her own indiscretions are, for the most part, legal blackmail."

The woman legislator said representatives of bar associations in New York and Chicago had asked for a copy of the measure to introduce in their state legislatures.

RELIEF WORKERS POSTPONE STRIKE

MARSHFIELD, Feb. 1.—(AP)—State emergency relief workers on Coos Bay were on the job "under protest" today as the result of a vote at a mass meeting attended by 100 men last night, at which it was decided to postpone a strike until groups opposing an hourly wage reduction could be given a hearing before the state grievance committee.

A strike had been called for this morning because hourly pay had been cut to 42½ cents from 50 cents.

Under the plan in effect today, however, net incomes are to remain the same due to increased number of hours allotted to each man.

ATTORNEY HIRING BY COMMISSIONS HIT IN HOUSE BILL

SALEM, Feb. 1.—(AP)—The house of representatives placed a curb upon the practice of hiring special attorneys by state boards and commissions today when it unanimously adopted H. B. 146 by Representative Lee Wallace, Multnomah.

The bill points out that the office of the attorney general was created to provide the other departments of the state with all necessary legal advice though it does permit the employment of special attorneys in cases of absolute necessity upon approval of the governor of state board of control in instances where these have full authority over the board or commission.

FREE ELECTRIC SERVICE FROM MUNICIPAL PLANT

ATLANTIC, Ia., Feb. 1.—(UP)—Mayor Joseph Burnes notified users of the municipal light plant's electricity today that they would be presented with cancelled bills for January. The bills, amounting to \$7500, will be paid from the plant's profits.
