

JEFFREY BLASTS OPPOSITORS OF TOWNSEND PLAN

800 Hear Portland Attorney at Armory Meeting — Present Relief System Scored—Collection Taken

"America on the March" was the theme of a 30-minute talk delivered by Judge John A. Jeffrey of Portland, former prosecuting attorney in southern Oregon, at the Armory last night before a crowd of approximately 800 Townsend old age pension plan enthusiasts who contributed a total of \$50. It was estimated by President Shurtleff, of the local Townsend club.

Having stopped in Medford on a speaking tour of Oregon and northern California, Judge Jeffrey, speaking in behalf of C. E. Hansen of Portland, state organizer for the movement, hit the opposition as making "fool" efforts to stand in the way of a "great crusade" that he declared would restore the nation's economic stability along the pathways of supply and demand.

Scuffs at Experts

Judge Jeffrey said there are many symptoms of the coming success of the plan, chief of which are the "fool" subsidized articles in the country's leading newspapers. Referring to Abraham Epstein's investigation, the speaker declared that such economic experts' advice is worthless. "In making his investigation," Judge Jeffrey said, "I hope Epstein will go so far as to find that what lies behind the plan is a force of 50,000,000 American people."

The speaker reviewed the tragic results of the depression, declaring that the national debt is increasing in tremendous figures, that relief conditions are steadily becoming worse, and that value has departed from property. "If the old system is carried on, two years from now we will be borrowing money to carry on the ordinary expense of government."

Relief System Scored

Judge Jeffrey described the national system of relief as a "patchwork" system. "The relief organization as it has been maintained has been a disgrace to white man's civilization," he declared. "When we go to the market for a pig of lard, we can hear the squeal of every pig that was plowed under for 'prosperity.'"

Judge Jeffrey hit the big producers and the federal reserve banking system as harvesting the wealth of the nation in their coffers. He described the Townsend plan as one whereby taxation would be lifted from every American home under \$3000 in value. "Spending money is an easy habit to learn," he said, describing many ways in which the pensioners would profit by using their proposed \$2000-month pension.

Would Release Wealth

The movement, which he said is not radical, but one of the great middle class, would release untold value by retiring those over 60 from competitive business and allowing a vast body of fit, young men and women to step in their places.

He referred to the experiences of European countries in pensioning their aged, declaring that nearly all white countries of Europe have been around the same vicious circle that America is traveling and have eventually established a retirement salary. "In Europe the Morgans and the Mellons cannot control the money of a country," he declared.

By the close of March, Judge Jeffrey said, it is hoped that 40,000,000 signatures will have been sent to Washington. "Congress cannot turn down 40,000,000 signatures," he said.

The speaker was born and raised in the Applegate district, having attended grade school there and high school at Jacksonville. He is a graduate of Oregon State college and has been practicing law in Portland for many years. While a resident of Medford, he was prosecuting attorney for Jackson, Josephine, Klamath and Lake counties.



SAMS VALLEY CAGERS TRIM WILLIAMS CREEK IN TWO-PLY CONTEST
