

### PREACHER AT NUDISTS PARTY FOR STUDY HE EXPLAINS TO OFFICERS

DENVER, Feb. 22.—(AP)—Whether the Rev. Fred T. Krueger, retired minister, went to a nudist meeting as a "thrill seeker" or as a student of a sociological problem, was disputed today.

The question may reach the Colorado conference of the Methodist church and the Rev. Mr. Krueger's future in the church hinges on the answer.

With 25 other men and women, he was arrested in a raid on a South Denver nudist colony. He faces police charges of contributing to delinquency of minors and to operation of a disorderly house.

Bishop Ralph S. Cushman explained that the clergyman should be ousted from the conference, if his case is officially considered, or he could be disciplined.

A great deal depends, the bishop said, on whether Rev. Krueger was at the nudist meeting to study a sociological problem, as he has explained. Many friends have rallied to his support.

### CULINARY CRAFT....

Pie for Washington.

The story is told that America's favorite dessert was invented in the home of George Washington. If that is true, certainly we should be timely in giving you some pie suggestions this week and let you enjoy a big helping of your favorite for dinner, or supper, on the evening of the 22nd.

Southern Fruit Pie.

- 1 1/2 cup flour
  - 1/4 teaspoon salt
  - 1 teaspoon baking powder
  - 1 tablespoon sugar
  - 3 tablespoons butter
  - 1 egg
  - One-third cup milk
  - 1 1/2 cups fruit.
  - Custard:
  - 2 egg yolks, beaten
  - 1/4 cup sugar
  - 1/2 cup milk
  - 1/2 cup nutmeg.
- Sift together the flour, salt, baking powder and sugar. Cut in the butter and add milk with slightly beaten egg. Combine all and spread on bottom and sides of pie pan. (Use spatula.) Fill with sliced fruit. Cover with custard mixture and bake at 430 degrees for 10 minutes, then at 350 for 30 minutes. Serve with a decoration of whipped cream or meringue made of the whites with 4 tablespoons of sugar.

- Cherry Pie.
  - 4 cups stoned cherries
  - 1 cup sugar
  - 1 tablespoon flour
  - 2 tablespoons butter.
- Line pan with pastry. Fill with the mixed cherries, sugar and flour. Dot with butter and cover with top crust. Bake at 450 degrees for 10 minutes and reduce to 325 degrees for 30 minutes.

- Lemon Meringue Pie
  - 5 tablespoons flour
  - 1 cup sugar
  - 2 eggs
  - 2 cups milk
  - 2 tablespoons melted butter
  - 1 lemon, juice and rind.
- Place in bowl the flour, sugar, yolks, butter, lemon and one cup of milk. Beat for three minutes with rotary beater. Add the remaining milk and fold in the beaten whites. Pour into a pan lined with raw pastry and bake at 350 degrees for 40 minutes.

- Rhubarb and Apple Pie.
  - 1 1/2 cups sliced rhubarb
  - 1 1/2 cups sliced apples
  - 3 tablespoons flour
  - 1 1/4 cups sugar
  - 1 tablespoon butter
  - Nutmeg (sprinkling).
- Combine all and put into lined pan, using raw pastry. Cover with strips of pastry, making lattice cover. Bake at 450 degrees for 10 minutes and reduce to 350 degrees for 30 minutes.

- Dutch Apple Cake.
- Make small rich biscuit dough and place in cake pan. Slice apples and arrange on top of the dough, fitting slices closely. Sprinkle with sugar and cinnamon and dot with 1 tablespoon of butter. Bake at 375 degrees for 30 minutes. Cut like pie and serve with cream.

- Pecan Cream Pie.
  - 1/2 cup sugar
  - 5 tablespoons flour
  - 1/4 cup milk
  - 1/4 teaspoon salt
  - 3 egg yolks
  - 1 1/2 cups scalded milk
  - 1 teaspoon vanilla
  - 1 cup chopped pecan meats.
- Blend the sugar, flour and salt with 1/4 cup cold milk, add to scalded milk and cook over low heat until thick, add beaten yolks carefully. Remove from range and add vanilla and nut meats. Cool and pour into baked shell. Top with meringue and brown in oven slowly.

BRUNO CHEERFUL IN POSTPONEMENT

TRENTON, N. J., Feb. 22.—(AP)—His execution postponed for at least three months, by appellate court action of attorneys, Bruno Richard Hauptmann, was reported in a cheerful mood today.

Hauptmann, said Attorney Frederick A. Pope after a death house conference, "is happy as can be under the circumstances."

The prisoner's wife, Anna, who also visited her husband said: "He was cheerful and keeping up very well as he always did and always will. He can do it only because he is innocent."

Pope said complete harmony now reigned among the four lawyers who defended Hauptmann and that they have agreed to continue the appeal begun together.

### ASSASSIN KNIFES SPONSOR OF BABE

TOKYO, Feb. 22.—(AP)—Babe Ruth's Japanese pal, Matsuzo Shoriki, probably will live, his physicians said today, despite the stab wounds by an assassin.

Shoriki is a prominent Japanese publisher and the man mainly responsible for last fall's barnstorming tour of Japan by Babe Ruth, Jimmy Fox, Lou Gehrig, Lefty Gomez, and other American baseball stars.

The assassin, Katsuzo Nagasaki, 38, told police he attacked Shoriki because the publisher had been guilty of several unpatriotic acts, including sponsorship of Babe Ruth's tour of Japan last fall.

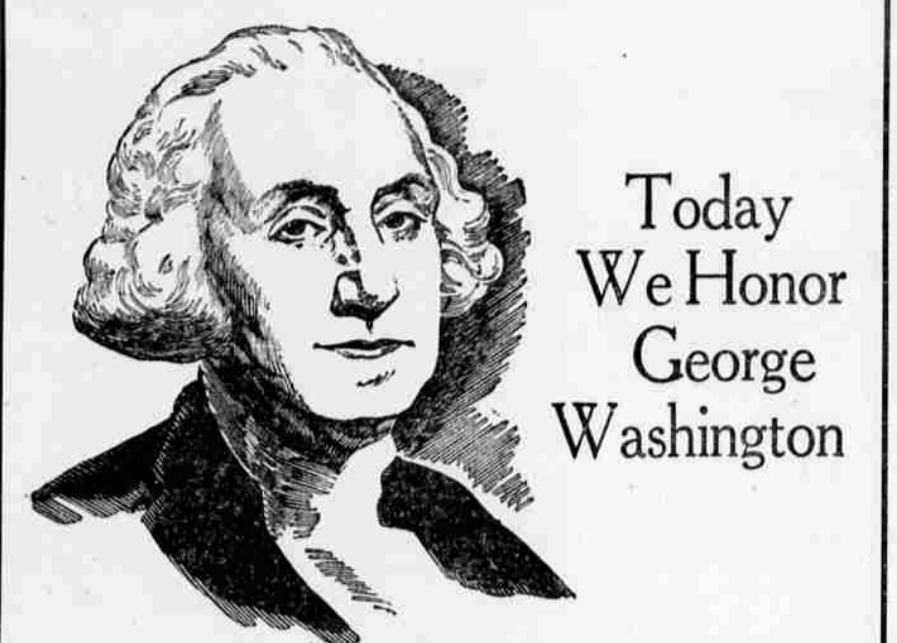
