employee of the state, under an act passed by the senate. The bill specifies particularly school teachers in order to eliminate possibility of communitate teachings.

To Supervise Pensions

Under the relief plan sponsored by the governor the state relief commission would be designated as the official agency to allocate and supervise all old age pension funds provided for the state during the next two years. The total outlays now provided for the two-year program would be in excess of \$6,500,000 as follows: Half million already made available by state liquor profits; four million dollars or better to be provided for general relief by each from liquor sales or sale of certificates of indebtedness against the income, and two million dollars, appropriated out of the general fund of the state, to be apportioned by county judges for old age pensions and relief of unemployables.

T. J. Edmonds, representative of the federal relief administration in the northwest, who was in conference with the governor on the program, declared he could not bind the federal administration to accept the governor's program but voiced his opinion Oregon's relief hurried the next two years had been cleared by the proposal.

Counties to Match Funds

In turning over funds for old-age pensions to the counties, the state relief committee will expect each county to provide as large a sum as is sent the county from the state organization. When the federal government is ready with an old-age pension plan, Governor Martin expects it will provide funds for up to \$15 a month pension, with the county providing up to an additional \$7.50 a month and the state a like amount.

Governor Martin said county judges were already working out amendatory legislation on old-age pensions which would make the Oregon statute coincide with federal legislation now being worked out on that subject.

A special session of the legislature can probably be avoided with the acceptance of this program by federal officials, Governor Martin indicated. Mr. Edmonds expressed himself as very pleased that Oregon had moved so quickly to work out a coordinated program. He pointed out that the counties were well-integrated in the program, that existing administrative machinery was to be used and that the state was ready with its funds.

Advisers to Governor Martin are busy preparing the needed legislative changes to make the entire three-point relief program effective.

Passage of the bill providing a uniform system of accounting for all municipal corporations and other sub-divisions of the state was urged by Governor Charles H. Martin today in a special message to the legislature.

MAYTAG SHIPPING TRAINLOAD WEST

NEWTON, Iowa, Feb. 26.—(Sp.)—Officials of the Maytag company announced today the shipment of a trainload of washing machines to dealers in the Pacific Northwest states. More than 3000 washers in thirty-five freight cars, valued at more than one-third of a million dollars, made up the train.

The order for the trainload was placed by the Maytag Pacific-Intermountain company, distributors for the territory, with headquarters at Portland, Oregon. T. A. Moler, company president, stated in a letter to the Maytag company, at the time the order was placed, that "Improved business conditions in the northwest, and the desire of both dealers and consumers to take advantage of present low prices have increased demand to the point where a trainload shipment is needed to take care of the immediate needs of our dealers."

"An encouraging sign," continued Mr. Moler, "is the demand for the more expensive aluminum tub models. The demand comes from the country as well as from the city, as a large proportion of those washers on order are to be shipped with Maytag gasoline Multi-Motors, for homes without electricity."

SAMS VALLEY QUINTET CALLS OFF E. P. CLASH

CULINARY CRAFT....

A Tropical Treat Since most of us, for one reason or another, are unable to visit the tropics for a winter vacation trip, why not reverse the program and have a bit of the tropics visit us now?



Estella Dorgan see in the mysterious home land if we were not so accustomed to seeing it that our imagination is no longer stirred, as surely was that of former North Americans upon the sight of the golden colored bananas.

Baked Bananas Bake in a moderate oven (375 degrees) in the skins for 10 minutes. Peel and sprinkle with a little lemon juice and paprika. Serve hot with meat course.

Bananas with Bacon Roll bananas with strips of bacon, fastening with toothpick. Broil until the bacon is crisp and serve immediately with a vegetable and hot rolls.

Banana Fritters Peel bananas, cut in halves or quarters, dip in batter and fry in deep fat at 305 degrees until golden brown. Serve with meat course.

Noodle Ring with Filling Peel and slice potatoes, drain, and fry in deep fat at 305 degrees until golden brown. Pour fat from sausage over the bananas and ring and serve immediately.

Banana Cake 3-3 c butter 1 1/2 c sugar 1-2 1/2 c flour 1 c mashed banana 2 eggs 1-3 c sour milk 1 t soda 1 t baking powder 1 c chopped walnuts Cream butter and sugar, add well beaten eggs, then the dry ingredients alternately with the mashed banana mixed with the sour milk. Add nut meats last. Bake in 2 layers at 375 degrees for 25-30 minutes.

Banana Pie (Cream) 3/4 c sugar 1-3 c flour 1/2 t salt 2 c scalded milk 4 bananas, sliced 1 t vanilla 2 eggs Sift together the sugar, flour and salt. Add enough cold milk to make a paste then add the eggs, slightly beaten. Combine with scalded milk and cook about 12 minutes, stirring occasionally. Pour into oiled shell and cover with tart jam and a meringue. Set in oven to brown slowly.

CONVICT ASTORIA MAYOR CANDIDATE

ASTORIA, Ore., Feb. 26.—(AP)—J. P. Morgan, a Democratic candidate for mayor of Astoria at the last general election, was convicted by a circuit court jury here last night on a statutory charge involving a minor girl.

The jury deliberated about six hours but returned a unanimous verdict. The trial lasted a week. Morgan asked for and was granted 30 days within which to file for a new trial. Sentence was delayed for that period.

At the time of his arrest several weeks ago Morgan declared he was the victim of a "political frame-up."
