BUTTER MARKET REMAINS LEVEL

PORTLAND, Ore., Feb. 27.—(AP)—There was no change in butter or buttermilk on the local exchange today.

While there was no further general change in the egg market for the day, an easy tone was suggested. Prices showed slight shading in spots where a surplus was beginning to show.

There was a light supply of live chickens in sight and prices continued firm. Leghorns were the chief desire of the trade and offerings were far below daily requirements.

While prices were generally held intact by distributors, a slow demand was showing for country killed hogs. Retailers report that the public was buying sparingly.

Country killed calves were in scant supply here with a continued famine in the trade and prices well held. Lambs were about steady. Beef demand remained keen at full prices.
