

Indian Behemoth Will See Action on Tonight's Wrestling Card

CHIEF STRONGBOW FACES JIM HEALY IN OPENING BRAWL

It will be a tough 60-minute session of wrestling for Don Wagner, big ex-Oregon State football star, when he exchanges grips and grunts in the top bout of a double main event card tonight with the mysterious Masked Marvel, mauler of men who not only kicks, bites, pulls hair and applies unorthodox holds, but uses a strange "pepper" in the eyes of his opponents despite the best of refereeing.

To make matters worse for the lanky farmer, who stands nearly a head taller than the Marvel and weighs 225 pounds, the mysterious mauler is in a regal state of mind from an experience at Klamath Falls when he was mobbed for his unruly mat work by enraged spectators. They attacked him as he was leaving the arena, after the had slugged the referee and fouled his opponent.

The hooded one ranks at the top of the various disguised wrestlers as far as box office attraction is concerned. Fans hope to see him defeated, yet are fascinated by his rough and tumble performances that always show plenty of color. He never discloses his name, even to the promoters, who say he is unidentified everywhere and has yet to lose his famous black mask.

Wagner is a popular grappler in Medford, where he has always displayed a clean, fast brand of wrestling featured by bone-crunching leg holds.

"Chief" Strongbow, huge Shawnee Indian grappler will make his first appearance here when he meets pugnacious Jimmy Healy of San Francisco in the first bout of this colorful pug-fest.

The behemoth Indian, who weighs 275 pounds, promises to be one of the greatest wrestling attractions ever to visit Medford. Not only his size and knowledge of Indian holds but his rough and tumble technique make him unique among wrestlers, who term him as most formidable.

Healy, who wrestled to a draw here last week with Joe Hubbs, in one of the fastest matches yet seen at the armory, is also in for a bad evening, but is confident that he will be able to take care of himself. Although he will be outweighed more than 50 pounds, the San Franciscan himself is no slouch. He impressed fans in his last demonstration here and will be a favorite in tonight's show.

The refereeing will be up to Fireman Ray Frisbie.

CLAIM COBB'S SON ASSAULTED GIRL

REDWOOD CITY, Cal., Feb. 28.—(AP)—Herschel Cobb, 15-year-old son of Ty Cobb, famous baseball star of other years, was to be arraigned in police court today on charges of assault and battery upon Miss Julia Conner, 19.

The youth's father expressed faith in Herschel's denial of the accusation and engaged counsel to fight the charge.

"I feel that my boy has been guilty of no wrong nor mistreatment nor any other action as charged in the complaint," he declared.

The complaint was filed against young Cobb by Mrs. Ethel B. Wade, stepmother of Miss Conner, and alleged he attacked the girl on February 12 when she repulsed his asserted advances. The youth, however, was not arrested until Tuesday and is now free on \$250 bail.

HUEY WOULD HOLD GOVERNOR'S CHAIR

BATON ROUGE, La., Feb. 28.—(AP)—Senator Huey P. Long announced today he would be a candidate for governor in 1936.

Long made the statement as the house of representatives, in special session, was rushing toward final passage a new batch of bills he dumped in the legislative hopper Tuesday night.

"I'd be fine to be governor of a state like this," he said, smiling broadly. "I think I'll be a candidate in 1936. Why, this state's got \$1,500,000 in the bank I'm going to run for governor."
