

WIDE VARIETY OF USES PERMITTED IN REPAIR LOANS

Plumbing, Lighting, Heating, Built-ins, Water Systems, Sewage Systems Are Among Many Provisions

On account of the many inquiries being received at the Housing Act Campaign headquarters regarding the type of improvements which come under the provisions of the act, Chamber of Commerce officials issued the following statement this morning taken from Bulletin No. 2, published by the Federal Housing Administration.

List of equipment considered as "built-in" under the regulations of the Federal Housing Administration, and therefore included in improvements which may be financed by insured loans:

Plumbing equipment, including fixtures, if permanently installed.

Individual lighting plants and equipment.

Incinerators and other garbage disposal systems, if built-in.

Non-detachable heating systems and equipment (coal, wood, oil, gas or electricity).

Domestic water heating equipment.

Oil burners, including oil storage equipment and thermostat controls.

Heating control devices.

Automatic stoking and ash removal equipment, if permanently installed.

Lighting fixtures if integral part of wiring or gas system.

Radiation, if part of heating system, including valves and accessories, including unit heaters.

Individual gas-making machines and equipment.

Water works system.

Wells and cisterns, including pumps and windmills.

Individual sewerage disposal systems, including septic tanks.

Water supply and sewerage connections with public mains.

Air-conditioning equipment.

Humidifying equipment, if built-in.

Built-in ventilating equipment, including fans.

Forced heat circulating equipment.

Fire escapes.

Sprinkler systems.

Fire and burglar alarm systems.

Elevators and dumb waiters.

Kitchen units if built-in.

Gas ranges and water heaters.

Electric ranges if permanently attached to wiring system.

Linoleum and other floor covering, exclusive of carpets, rugs, and matting.

Built-in ironing boards, dinettes, flower boxes, cabinets, bookcases and cupboards.

Built-in laundry chutes.

Built-in refrigerators, including automatic refrigeration if permanently attached to wiring or gas system.

Fitted storm doors and sash built for porches, windows, etc.

Fitted screen doors and windows built for porches, windows, etc.

New doors and windows of all kinds.

Built-in door or wall mirrors.

Automatic garage door openers.

Weather stripping.

Awnings and other sun protections for windows and porches.

Coal chutes.

Built-in package receivers and mail boxes.

Concealed residential wall safes.

All applied wall coverings.

Wall and floor tiles.

The above items are given as examples of the type of equipment which, under the regulations, become "a part of the real estate when installed." There may be other equipment of like characteristics, which, if it becomes a part of the property when installed, likewise may be included.

The following list includes types of equipment which, under the regulations are "movable" and therefore may NOT be included in improvements financed by insured loans:

Furniture, unless built-in.

Floor and other lamps.

Show cases, unless built-in.

Benches.

Radios, unless built-in.

Porch swings.

Electric fans unless built-in.

Toasters.

Washing machines.

Electric and gas irons.

Ranges and stoves—gas, electric, coal or wood, unless built-in.

Food mixing machines.

Vacuum and other types of cleaners, unless built-in.

Individual detachable gas and electric heaters.

Single-unit air conditioners, unless built-in.

All other strictly detachable and movable equipment and apparatus.

intent to influence such officer to act in his official capacity in a particular manner so as to produce or prevent any particular result, such person, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by imprisonment in the penitentiary not less than one nor more than ten years, or by imprisonment in the county jail not less than one month nor more than one year, or by a fine of not less than \$100 nor more than \$1000."

Letter Quoted.

Word of the threatened recall was given the newspapermen by the executive after he had issued a statement relative to the state relief situation in which he pointed out what the legislature and he were doing to provide relief. "Despite this showing, I received this letter today from Pendleton," he announced, and then read it as follows:

"We stand one hundred per cent against your relief program as outlined and Senator Wagon's old age pension bill. Old people are not looking for dole or charity. Nor are we ready to accept blood money from our state saloons.

"Should those bills be passed and you refuse to memorialize congress to pass the McGorarty bill, we stand ready to take the field in Umatilla county and elsewhere in the state for a recall measure for each and everyone who supports such legislation.

"We work for those who work for us.

"The Umatilla County Townsend Old Age Pension club, membership 12,000, B. E. Anderson, president, by Frank W. Evans, secretary."
