The tricky, fascinating and seductive rhythms of Cuba's native dances form the accompaniment and background for the dramatic love story of George Raft's new picture "Rumba," starting a three day run at the Rialto theatre today. Carole Lombard, his partner in "Bolero" is again co-starred and the supporting cast includes Margo, Lynne Overman, Iris Adrian, Monroe Owsley and Gail Patrick, among others.

The torrid romance of a tempestuous dancer and a madcap heiress forms the story of "Rumba." Raft is shown as a cabaret dancer in Havana, exiled from Broadway by threats of gang vengeance. Then he falls in love with Miss Lombard but, her parents hearing of the romance, force her to return to New York.

In order to be near the girl he loves, the dancer accepts a starring part in a Broadway show and, despite warnings from the gang, prepares to go through with his contract. The story moves to a rapid climax in which the two lovers are rejoined in the ecstatic "Rumba"—the Cuban dance of love.
