PHOENIX, Ariz., March 5.—(AP)—Sale of 110,000 pounds of wool in the Salt River valley to eastern points is reported. The purchases, first of the 1935 crop, were at 15 to 15 1/2 cents a pound, as compared to 30 cents a pound last year. The low price, it was said, is due to the large "carry-over" stock of wool in eastern warehouses.

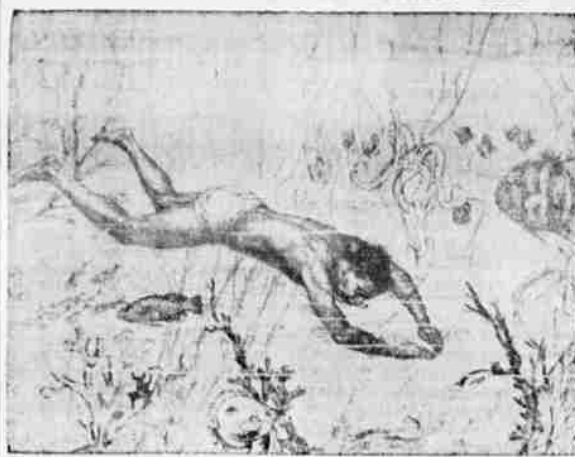
