LEGISLATIVE GLUT SPELLS EXTENSION INTO COMING WEEK

The senate, after debating a three-way report on the bill which would open the upper Columbia river to sailing, from five miles above the Bonneville dam to the Deschutes river, passed the measure by a vote of 20 to 8.

Neither house had made any dent upon the calendars at noon. The amusement tax bill, which was introduced by Representatives Ulen, Hirsch and Magruder, came out unexpectedly by the assessment and taxation committee after it was believed the issue was safely stowed away in the committee. The favorable report was adopted, which places the bill on the calendar.

The bill assesses a 10 per cent tax on all types of amusement, and all tickets for events must be purchased from the state treasurer. The proceeds would go for old age pensions and the state pension law would be changed to raise the maximum per month to \$45 and reduce the size of eligibility to 65 years.

Slot Machines Would Aid. The old age pensions would also benefit by the slot machine bill which was passed by the house and is now in the senate where it will either be amended and passed or be killed after an anticipated battle.

The liquor bill passed by the house, in addition to raising the beer tax to \$1.30, would levy a tax on wines of 12 1/2 cents per gallon on naturally fermented products and 30 cents on fortified. In addition an ad valorem tax of 10 per cent on naturally fermented wines in bottles, 15 per cent on bottled fortified and sparkling wines in bottles would be assessed.

Brewery interests were battling the more than 100 per cent increase in the beer tax. Of this tax, the measure provided, 30 cents would go to cities in lieu of special city taxes. Closing of the Alsea river to golfing from Saturday noon to Sunday noon to permit sportsmen to troll was passed by the house, also approved.

Appropriation bills also passed provided for the payment of salaries and expenses in connection with the executive, state and treasury departments; and appropriating \$6000 for the use of soldiers' and sailors' commission to carry out provisions of the act pertaining to its duties.
