

BARUCH SUGGESTS ELIMINATION TAX FREE SECURITIES

by Chairman Nye (R., N. D.) that the committee was not criticizing Baruch's wartime record but suggesting only to gain the advantage of his experience in formulating a plan to take the profits out of war.

Other members made similar statements after Senator Byrnes (D., S. C.) had declared "unfair" any limitations on Baruch's record which might have grown out of the committee investigation.

"When I saw the criticism about his wartime financial transactions," Byrnes said, "I felt it necessary to state the facts on the case."

He added he was chairman of a special deficiency committee of the house appropriations committee during the war and knew in detail all the transactions concerning Baruch.

He related that Baruch had financed a mission to Europe to learn if any American goods were being diverted by the Allies from military purposes to commercial purposes.

In war ended and many wartime functions, including the war industries board, were terminated. Baruch saw that many young girls who had come to Washington would be thrown out on the streets.

"He employed a matron to visit all the girls in his department and encourage them to go home rather than to walk the streets in Washington trying to find work."

"An indication he paid their fare home, together with tuition and expenses. Most of them went home."

Members of the committee joined in assuring no reflection against Baruch's record was intended.

ADVISORY JURORS TO MEET FRIDAY

Subpoenas were issued today by the district attorney's office for witnesses to appear tomorrow in circuit court in the advisory jury case on the indictment returned against Roster P. (Red) Carroll, charging involuntary manslaughter, as a result of the auto accident February 9 on West Main street in which June Rose Hansen, 13, sustained mortal injuries.

Carroll entered a plea of guilty Tuesday and Circuit Judge H. D. Norton ordered calling of an advisory jury to consult with the court on the sentence and clemency, if any, to be accorded Carroll.

The court named Attorney E. E. Kelly as counsel for Carroll.

In the civil suit for approximately \$10,000 damages, filed by C. A. Hansen, father of the dead girl, against Carroll, a motion to strike certain sentences of the complaint was filed yesterday by Carroll's attorney.

The motion claims a number of allegations in the complaint are "sham, irrelevant and redundant, and entered not as a cause of action, but in an effort to bar a discharge in bankruptcy of any judgment that may be rendered." It is asserted in the motion that "the allegations conflict and they all cannot be true."

An Oregon supreme court decision is quoted in support of the defense contention.

There is grounds for removal of community optimism," Arnapiger added. Application for the loan was filed in August, 1933, and the loan was allocated to the Medford district in February, 1934, by the reconstruction corporation. Sufficient bonds were impounded by July 1 last, to proceed with negotiations for the loan.

The burden of the ponderous legal details, such as supreme court test cases, attorney general's opinion, consulting bond attorney opinions, and conferences at Washington, D. C., was handled by Attorney Porter J. Neff of this city. Detailed bookkeeping operations were handled by the Medford commission, the state reclamation commission, and the reclamation bank, entailing a vast amount of time and work to complete the transaction.

The United States department of agriculture, in cooperation with the county relief committee and the county agricultural agent's office, is making a fruit tree and berry acreage census of Jackson county, it was announced by County Horticulturist Leslie P. Wilcox today.

AUTOMOBILE-AIRPLANE CAN BE ACCOMMODATED IN RESIDENCE GARAGE

PHILADELPHIA, March 28.—(AP)—A combination automobile and airplane, which the Autogiro company of America believes can be converted easily from one to the other, is nearing completion, and Uncle Sam will be the first to get one.

The duel land and air machine, for which the department of commerce has awarded a contract for the first full-sized model, is being rushed at the Autogiro plant at nearby Willow Grove for display at a commerce department meeting in Washington soon.

James G. Ray, Autogiro company vice-president, says it will be small enough to fit in an ordinary garage, from which it can be driven to the nearest flying field, and charged to an auto.

The blades fold back over the tail when it is an automobile. "A machine like this would make it possible for a private owner to back his plane out of a garage at home, just as he does his automobile, drive through any kind of traffic to the nearest flying field and take off for any point," Ray said.
