BY a vote of 318 to 90, which is a majority of three and a half to one, the national house of representatives approves the Patman bill

THIS question immediately arises: Would issuing two billion dollars of additional paper money wreck us?

HERE is the way it would work: If the soldiers bonus were paid by the easy process of starting the printing presses, the next step would be to meet the staggering relief needs in the same way

THE next step would be still MORE INFLATION, on the theory that if all we have to do to get what we want is to run the printing presses for a little while, why not run them ALL THE TIME and have EVERYTHING we want

ANOTHER illustration: You are in severe and terrible pain, and after you have stood it about as long as you think you can you take a LITTLE morphine

INFLATION IS MONEY MORPHINE: It chases away the pain of heavy taxation, which in the nominal course of events must follow heavy spending

THE trouble is that it doesn't work that way. When we find how easy inflation is, we keep it up until we are ruined

THAT is why this Patman bill which was approved by a three to one majority by the lower house of congress, is dangerous

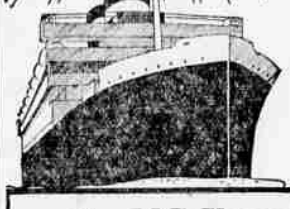

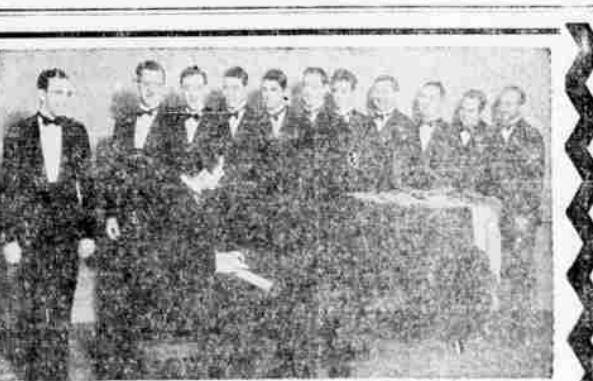
