COAST TELEPHONE INSTALLATION UP; PROSPERITY SIGN

SAN FRANCISCO, March 30-(AP) -One more sign of increasing momentum of the Pacific coast business recovery came today from N. R. Powley, president of the Pacific Telephone & Telegraph Co. Powley reported his company's gain in telephones in the first two months of this year was 9746, compared with 2661 in the 1934 period. The rate of increase more than tripled. There are now 1,478,900 telephones in service.

Total and long distance revenues, he said, increased 7.4 per cent over the corresponding two months of last year. Total revenues were \$15,145,000 compared with \$14,496,000 last year. Total operating expenses, including taxes, were \$11,972,000-an increase of \$871,000. Net income lacked \$108,000 of covering dividend requirements for the two months.

Included in the total telephone revenues was a sum of \$66,300 which may have to be refunded to telephone users in Oregon in the event of an adverse decision in that state's suits involving rates.

KLAMATH FALLS, March 30-(AP) -Kenneth Buell, 7, was critically injured this afternoon when he touched off a dynamite cap while playing in the yard of his home at Tule Lake in northern California. The child was brought to a Klamath Falls hospital. Kenneth's legs were so badly mangled, doctors believed it necessary to amputate both. The boy also lost an eye. His recovery was doubtful.
