

DROP FOOD TO MAROONED MINERS



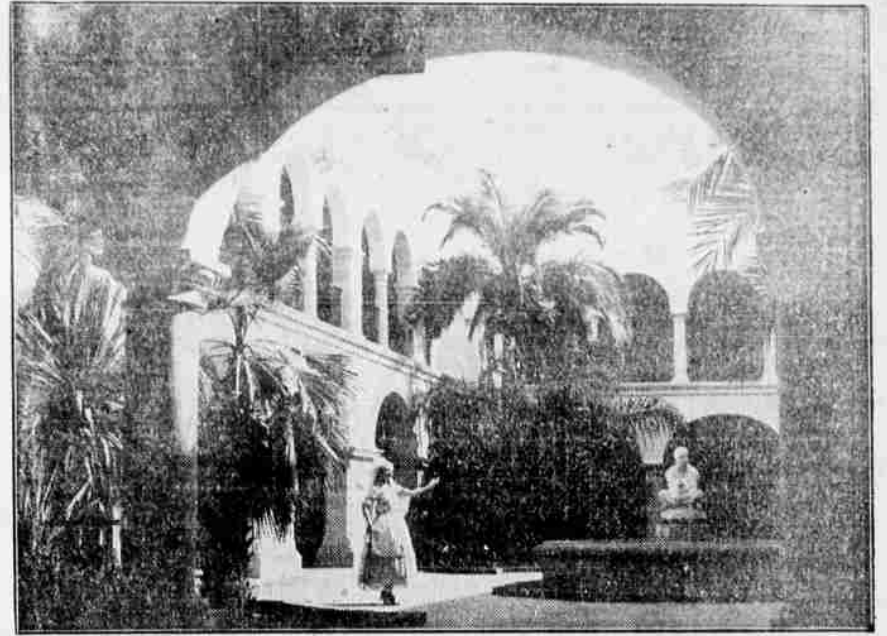

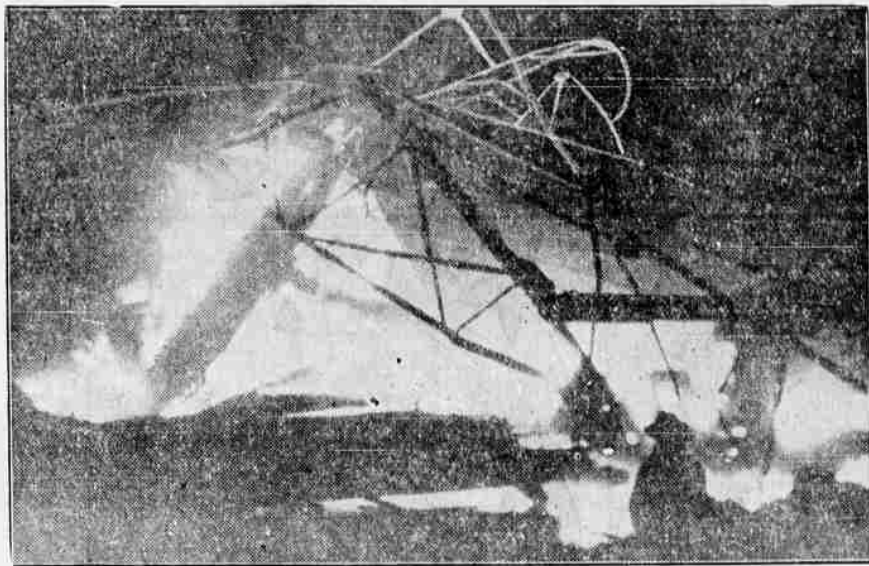

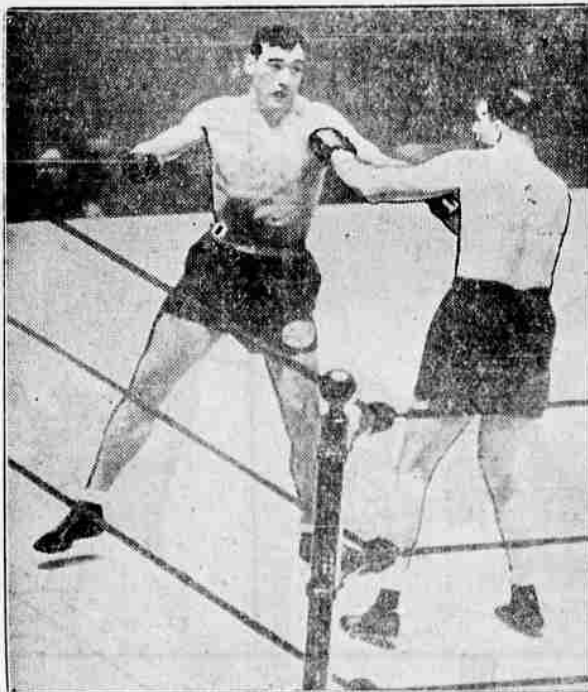
