

**GUILLESS SCRIBE
HEARS BIG PLANS
AT COUNTY C. OF C.**

With the cry "Increase the Deficit" the Jackson county chamber of commerce swung into action today on a new five-year program to dredge Bear creek to the sea, so that battle vessels of the United States fleet can proceed up as far as Medford to participate in Armistice Day programs here in the future.

The new program, one of the most comprehensive to be undertaken in the history of the chamber, is expected to start a boom in this city, and launch one of the greatest expansions in the history of the Pacific coast.

"For many years," said A. H. Banwell, manager of the chamber, "it has been a public disgrace that this city has had no battleships upon which to sprinkle flowers from the Bear creek bridge." Many letters from citizens, prominent and otherwise, gave rise to the great project, when the public gave indication that it would no longer tolerate the shameful situation. "Medford has been in the back seat long enough," said W. S. Bolger, former president of the chamber, thumping the table.

Another project of tremendous importance to this community to be launched will be the construction of a tram-way, starting at the rim of Crater lake, clearing the coast range, and swooping down upon the coast at a point near Gold Beach, where a huge amusement park is to be built at public expense. The park, which will be the largest of its kind in the world, has been tentatively named New Medford, and contracts for the work will be let in the near future, it was learned today.

New stream-lined cars will be built by the Boeing airplane factory, which has indicated a desire to start a factory here. The cars, which will run on the Crater-lake-to-the-sea tram, will be capable of attaining even greater speeds than those attained by high school students on South Oakdale, if plans of the company for new models, now in the wind-tunnel stage of development, are completed.

In order to clear the air for the huge caravans of incoming settlers, work is to begin in the next day or two on blasting off 800 feet from the top of Roxy Ann, which has been condemned as a hazard to airplanes.

"What a day for Medford!" chorused Banwell and Bolger to the reporter as the latter fled from the scene dizzily, but carefully avoiding a plump and inviting looking purse lying on the sidewalk that serves for a front step to the chamber offices. He bit on that one two years ago and hasn't lived it down entirely yet.
