PARIS—(UP)—Electrification of railroads in France has been going on at a rapid pace during the past few years and one company, the Paris-Orleans-Midi, now has 1652 miles of electrified track.

The P. O. M. is far ahead in the modernization process than the other lines of France, who for various reasons, mostly military, have not adopted electric traction extensively.

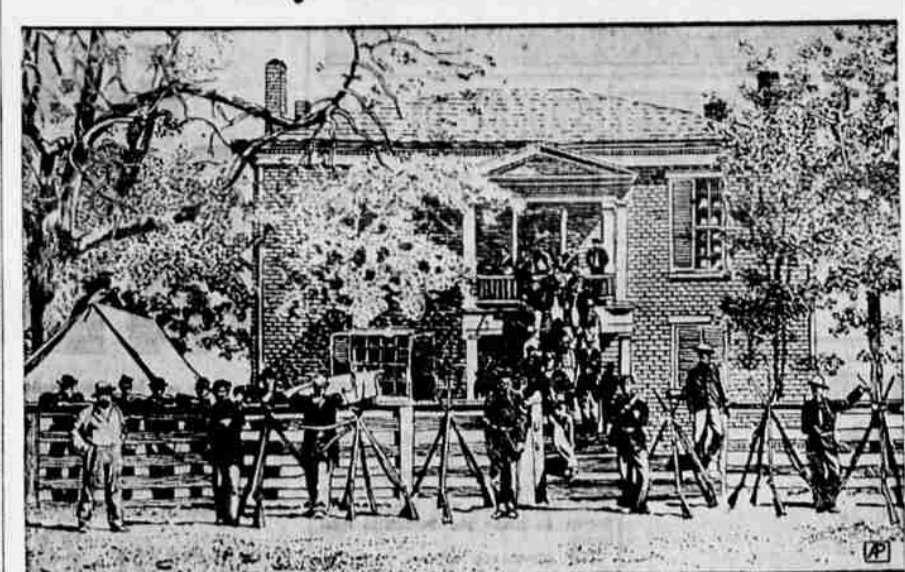
SAN QUENTIN CONS HEAR DEATH EDICT

Appomattox National Park Proposed Seventy Years After Lee Surrender

APPOMATTOX, Va. (AP)—Not even in stone will Lee and Grant ever meet again on the field they chose for ending the war between the states 70 years ago on April 9.

Field May Be Restored Joel Flood, former Virginia congressman now serving as chairman of the Appomattox Memorial park association, says the proposed monument "is definitely out," but that prospects are good for restoration of the battlefield into a national park.

Several years ago congress authorized an appropriation of \$100,000 for the monument, but the money was not used.

Government engineers have surveyed the battlefield area and recently Arno B. Cammerer, director of the National Park Service, inspected the territory.

VAN DYKES WIN IN AUTO DAMAGE SUIT

A circuit court jury late yesterday, after fifteen minutes deliberation, returned a verdict in favor of Vern Van Dyke and Inez Van Dyke. In the damage suit of Minnie White against them for \$10,000 general damages, \$540 for loss of time, and \$138.10 for medical aid, Van Dyke was dismissed as a defendant after the suit got underway. It was the second time this week that a circuit jury returned a verdict denying damages to plaintiffs in a damage suit.

ITALY SPEEDS UP HIGHWAY PROGRAM ON DUCE'S DECREE

ROME—(UP)—Italy has spent \$100,000,000 during the past six years for highway construction, official figures of the Autonomous Road Board show.

Mussolini has decreed that the road building program will continue until Italy has established herself in first place in Europe and the glories of the Roman Empire road system are recaptured.

Highway construction has been undertaken with a view toward attracting tourists. Six years ago highways bordered by trees, totalled but 83 miles, while today the total has been increased to 3764 miles.
