PORTLAND, April 10.—(AP) Negotiations with two manufacturers of whisky had today relieved the newly organized Oregon liquor control commission of a heavy "overstock" of slow-moving brands ordered by the old commission.

One company, it was learned after an executive session of the board last night, has agreed to cancel an order on 3,300 cases and has reduced the price by \$1.50 a case on another lot of 850 cases. Another company has agreed to exchange 2,000 cases of slow-moving brands for more popular bottles.

As a result of the compromise, it was said, it is believed the commission will be able to clean up the transactions without loss to the commission's revenue.

PHONE OPERATING NET TAKES FEBRUARY DIP NEW YORK, April 10.—(AP)—Net operating income of the American Telephone & Telegraph Co. in February totaled \$1,187,474 compared with \$1,531,849 in the same month last year. These figures cover operating activity only, excluding non-operating income such as dividends, real estate and other revenues received and non-operating charges such as rents and interest paid.
