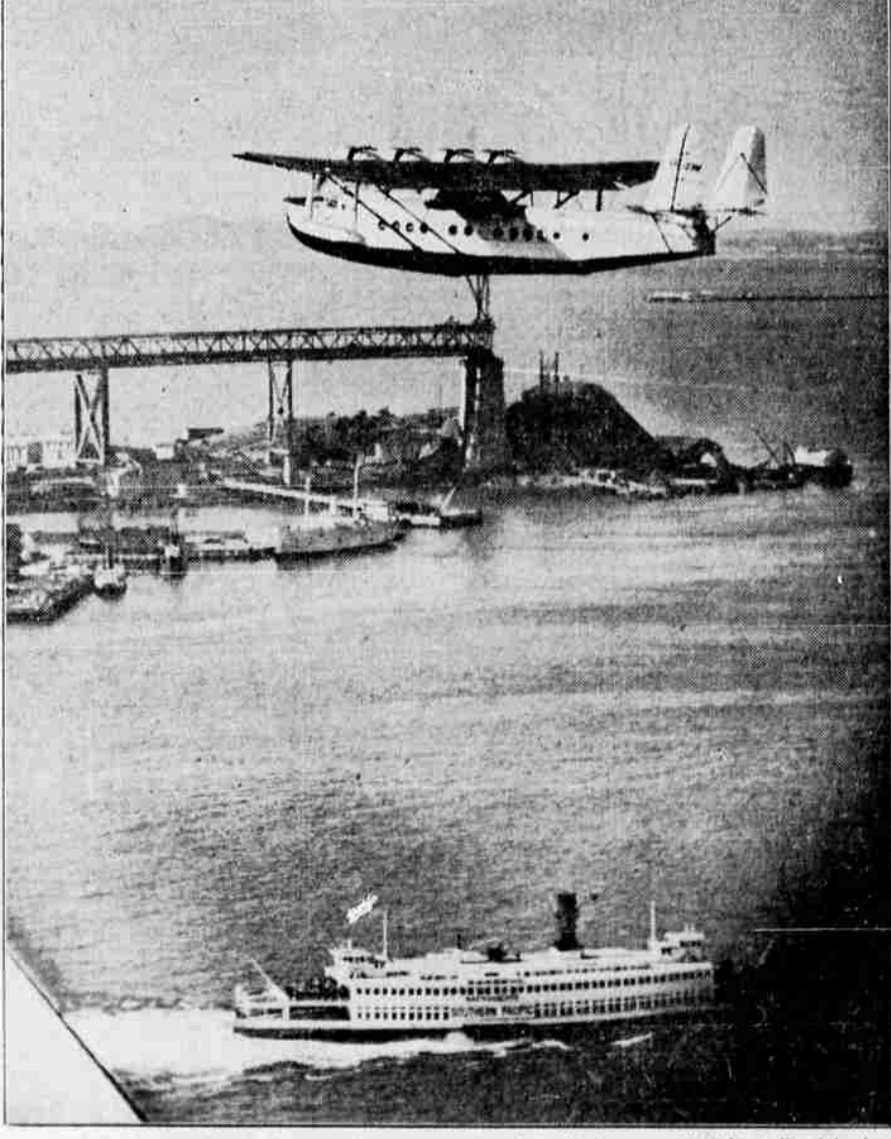
LUMBER STRIKE HELD CERTAINTY

PORTLAND, Ore., April 17.—(AP)—While union men described the statement as "the same old lockout threat," Frank Hanson, president of the Eastern & Western Lumber Co. here, declared: "We certainly will close down," if the proposed May 6 strike of lumber workers actually is called.
