

# ACQUIT WALKER IN FIRST OF DOG TAX COLLECTION CASES

Roy A. Lee, clothier, a neighbor, and wife, license. The Lee dog was accustomed to play on the Walker lawn.

It was testified that Mrs. Walker had given the building, a house pet, to her sister when they felt they could not afford to purchase a dog license.

Walker admitted that he had no license for the building, when the notice was left by Pettay. It was evident Pettay, from the evidence, had mistaken the Lee police dog, as the property of the Walkers.

Mrs. Bottrick testified that the building was given to her, by her sister, and that the day after the complaint was filed, she had purchased a dog license from the county clerk.

County Clerk Carter testified there was no record of a dog license issued to Clay Walker.

Attorney M. O. Wilkins, representing Walker moved for a directed verdict, which the court denied. Attorney Wilkins held that the dog license law was unconstitutional on the grounds it delegated legislative authority to the county court, contrary to the state constitution. The defense also held the state had not introduced the county order, fixing the penalty for failure to procure the dog license, within the time limit.

The court held the jury was not concerned with the constitutionality of the dog license law and "at least 2,800 people in the county know there is a dog tax, as they have come in and paid it."

The next dog case scheduled is that of J. C. Berrang of Phoenix, who won wide publicity ten years ago by driving a team of oxen across the country from Connecticut to Phoenix, stopping in front of the Chamber of Commerce en route. Berrang has entered a plea of not guilty, and his hearing has been set for next Tuesday morning.

It is reported that defendants in half a dozen dog license complaints will demand jury trials.
