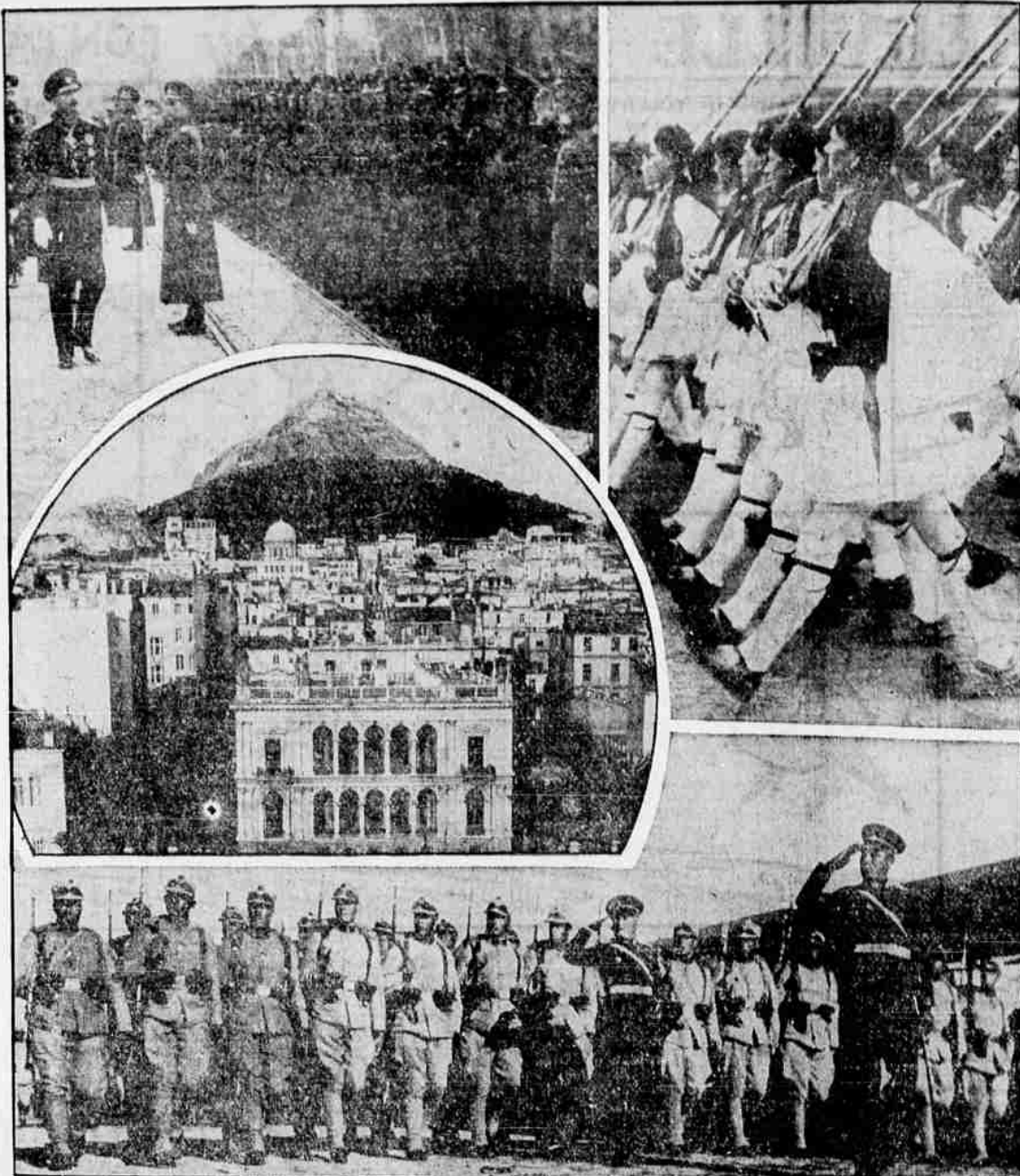


GERMAN LEADERS PARADE STREETS

The rumble of big guns shook the Balkans, battleground of the centuries, as the world watched anxiously Greece's desperate efforts to put down her ninth and most serious revolt in 26 years. With the fighting spreading swiftly over land and sea, Athens (a view of which is shown in circle) was believed threatened. Bulgarian, Turkey and Yugoslavia continued to strengthen their border guards as charges of preparations for war were hurled back and forth at Geneva. CHARGED WITH "MOB MURDER"



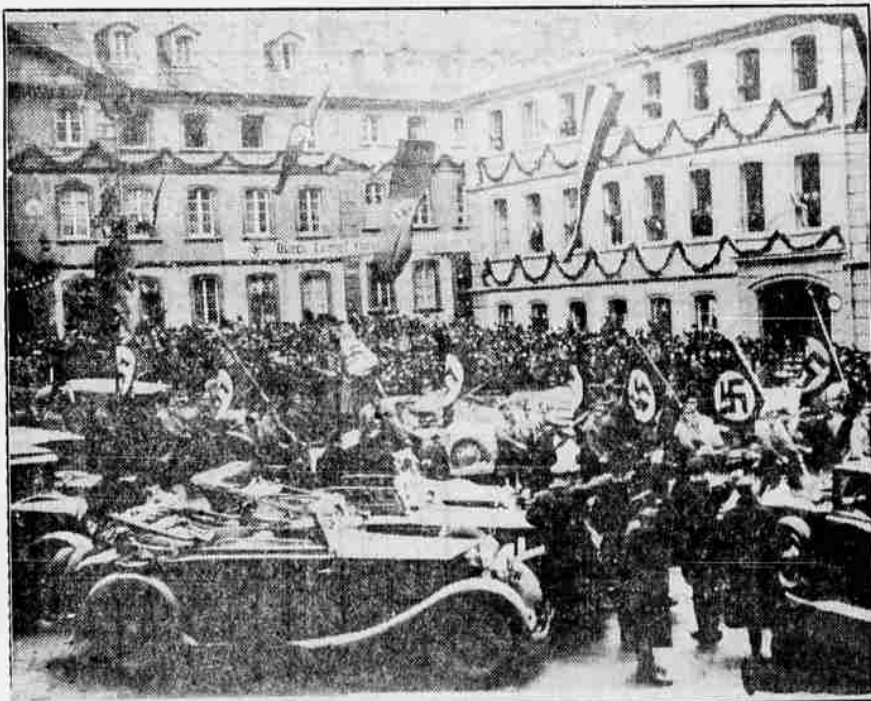

HITLER TROOPS PARADE THROUGH REGAINED CITY



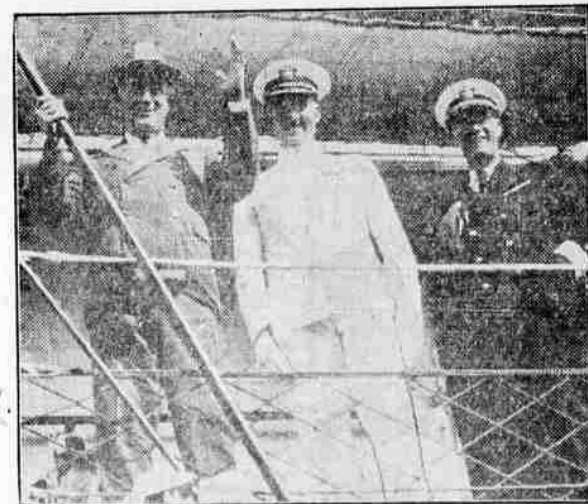
