State Seeks \$345,000 Advance for Bridges
SALEM, April 23.—(AP)—An application for an advance of \$345,000 on the federal grant for construction of the Oregon coast bridges was being prepared by J. M. Devers, attorney for the highway commission, to be filed with the Public Works administration at Washington this week.

Devers said future applications would increase the grant to \$1,400,000, based on an original loan and grant of \$3,900,000. The grant application being filed now was the first since work on the bridges began.
