"The people are highway minded," he continued. "Of the \$12,000,000 we are going to get this year, much will be spent on highways. First we will rebuild the road over the Siskiyou, and I assure you that to show my gratitude to Jackson county, the Siskiyou road will come under my special consideration."
Laurel County Solons
In reviewing the outstanding accomplishments of the recent session of the state legislature, Governor Martin praised Senator George W. Dunn of Ashland and Representatives Glenn O. Taylor and A. Moore Hamilton of this city. He praised the lat-

ter as peer of 10 outstanding young men in the house.
The speaker said that in comparing the work of the legislature to that in Washington and California, there is every reason to believe that much was accomplished. "When they failed, I straightened them out," the governor added in one of the sparkling witticisms of the speech. He said in the event of a special session, the legislature may pass some of the 25 bills that he vetoed. He backed up his vetoes as "all good ones," made in an effort to bring the state out of the depression with banners flying.
Governor Martin's reference to the state planning board brought laughs and applause from the audience, when he said "There's not a politician, thank God, on that board. I don't know what their politics are and I don't give a damn."
Self Help Spirit Needed
The speaker said that much money is to be spent wisely in the development of the Willamette valley. He gave a graphic comparison of that region with Holland, using figures to show the relative low productiveness of the valley.
In conclusion, the governor stressed the need to bring the people of Oregon to a sense of self help, to develop the state through the proper, strong leadership. "It is a great indictment to the state to lie down and listen to the subversive elements," the governor said. "I want to head the people in a spirit of the offensive. We must thrive on hardships."

ELLIOTTS LEAVING FOR KANSAS VISIT

Fire Chief Roy Elliott, accompanied by Mrs. Elliott, will leave by auto tomorrow for a month to six weeks' visit with his family and old friends in Gridley, Kansas, the first trip to his boyhood neighborhood in 12 years. The Elliotts will drive to Reno, from there to Salt Lake City, and from there to the Utah capital to Denver. From Denver they will drive on into Gridley, a short distance from Kansas City.
