On May 31st, Dr. Eaton will have completed ten years of pastoral service with this church and plans to retire at that time from pastoral service. The church has called Rev. Welford A. Dawes of Vancouver, Wash., and it is expected that he will assume its pastoral leadership on July 1st.
Among the activities of the church none take a larger place than is given the Sunday School. This school is departmentally organized and closely graded, and enjoys the ministrations of an efficient corps of officers and teachers whose evangelistic and cultural ideals are high. There are classes for all ages, and those classes above the primary department are organized with live officers and working committees.
The women of the church are organized under the name of The

working cabinet, and consists of all the officers of the church and the standing committees. With this board the pastor confers from time to time upon matters of importance to the interests of the church.
The Brotherhood is the men's organization of the church. It functions particularly in the work of the men's class in the Sunday School, as well as in various other ways of helpfulness to the church. It is a fine promoter of good fellowship among the men and is highly effective in giving the men power and authority in the church to the accomplishment of its tasks.
The young people of the church are organized under the general caption of Young People's Union and are divided into three groups according to age—senior, junior and intermediate. The groups meet simultaneously in their several rooms at 6:30, Sunday eve-

nings for devotion, Bible study and discussion, of various interests and experiences in Christian life and service. These group meetings are invaluable as help to Christian living and as training classes in the professional and administrative phases of preparation for participation in the general activities of the church. Their officers are chosen subject to the approval of the church, and each group has its counsellor chosen from the church.
