DRUNKEN DRIVING IN TRUCK, CLAIM

Gary George Rapp, truck driver for the Consolidated Freight line, is in the county jail today charged with driving while intoxicated, according to a state police report. The report states that Rapp, driving a heavy truck from this city to Roseburg, hit a concrete bridge just north of Barney's Grill about 10 o'clock last night, turning the huge truck on its side, breaking away part of the bridge. The truck slid for 150 yards on its side before coming to a stop in the middle of the highway.

The truck was carrying, among other things, several barrels of oil, the contents of which soaked Rapp thoroughly. A wrecker from Grants Pass was summoned, and righted the machine, taking it into Gold Hill for minor repairs. It was not seriously damaged, and will be sent on to Roseburg today. Police say that Rapp had been drinking heavily.

SHIPPING BETTER: TRADE, INDUSTRY ON COAST GAINS

SAN FRANCISCO, April 27.—(AP)—Shipping along the Pacific coast was active with import-export business substantially ahead of last year. Trans-Pacific passenger traffic is at top levels. General trade and industry continued steady at about 5 to 10 per cent over last year. Better activities tapered off seasonally. (By the Associated Press)

The nation's business, influenced last week by both spring and summer trade cycles, displayed an undertone of strength. Although some sections, notably the east, reported retarding influences which hampered the growth of a distinct trend in either direction, a number of analyses agreed that general business and industry moved forward.

Flying the flag of "prosperity peaks," the automobile industry produced 110,790 units last week, the highest week production since August of 1929.

The trend of motor output has been upward for many months, and Cram's said production estimates for May give indication of little or no decline from April. Dealers' statements to manufacturers show a comparable condition in the retail field with the used car market declining as an adverse influence on new car sales.

AIR EXCURSIONS START TUESDAY

For the first time in Medford, excursion airplane flights over the city will be made at night next Tuesday, April 30, in an all-metal Ford trimotor ship operated by the Western Airplane Distributors of Kansas City, Mo.

The plane will arrive here Tuesday on a tour which is being made to create general interest in flying and especially in night flying, according to advance announcers. Excursions over the valley will start at 2 p. m. Tuesday and continue during the afternoon, specializing in the night excursions after sunset until 10 p. m. The big ship is a 14-passenger, \$50,000 trimotor, just off the airline between Detroit and Cleveland.
