"undue" influence of the jury in the following particulars:
Attorney General David T. Wilenta' opening address to the court and jury, and his summation.
Prosecutor Anthony M. Hauck's opening to the court and jury at the conclusion of the taking of testimony.
The daily presence of Colonel Charles A. Lindbergh and "other prominent personages" and their "close proximity to the jury during the sessions."
"Outbursts of spectators in the courtroom."
The "confusion and disorder reigning in the court room during sessions of the court."
The stories carried by press and radio before the trial, which conveyed to the jury panel a picture of the defendant "as a hardened criminal and a man of steel who would be likely to commit the crime for which he was charged."
The "failure to actually sequester the jury during the trial and separate it from the mass of the community and the resultant expressions of public opinion which were conveyed to them."

He believed the resolutions presented a "break" with the president, but said he hoped to discuss the chamber's highly critical program with the chief executive in a "friendly way."
He said the chamber's program was not "reactionary."
Noting the vigorous controversies on the convention floor, which broke all precedents for recent years, Sibley said that was an indication that the "business reaction is pretty lively."
F. R.'s Patient Unknown.
Asked if he thought the president was pleased with the chamber's program, Sibley remarked, "I don't know." He said he did not think the program should be called "antagonistic."
In connection with reports presidential anger with the chamber has been indicated by his failure to send a message to the convention, Sibley said:
"There was no discussion of the possibility of the president sending a message to the chamber, and no slight was involved."
In response to a question as to how important the differences of opinion between the president and the chamber were, he said they were "pretty crucial." He added he did not expect to see President Roosevelt before next week, when he would present the chamber's resolutions.

tion's expansion of the British air forces in order to maintain parity with neighboring powers.
The government head told the house of commons there would be an expansion of the air strength "beyond those provided for in the estimates this year in order to implement Mr. Baldwin's declaration."
Supplementary aviation expenditures exceeding 2,000,000 pounds (\$18,000,000) were provided for by parliament in February following a declaration by Stanley Baldwin, lord president of the council, that Great Britain should maintain aviation parity with any country "within striking distance."
