THE special session of the state legislature will be called for two main purposes, and two only. To arrange for the construction of a new state capitol, and to make the state program for social security and relief, conform with the federal program.

But unless the people bestir themselves and in some way make their wishes known, all sorts of extraneous matters and half baked issues will be presented,—the net result of which will be merely to extend the time of the session, increase its expense, and contribute absolutely NOTHING to the betterment of the state.

ALREADY a member of the Portland delegation has served notice he will introduce a measure to bring about the transfer of the state capitol from Salem to Portland—a crack-pot scheme if there ever was one, which even the Portland Chamber of Commerce opposes.

But there will be more of them unless SOMETHING is done. Our suggestion is that a movement be started now to pledge the members of the House and Senate, to refuse to introduce or consider ANY proposal that does not deal with the two main subjects, for which the special session will be called, or with measures of a REAL EMERGENCY character!

IF such an agreement could be reached before the session opens, a great deal of needless friction and confusion would be avoided, waste of time and taxpayers' money prevented; and constructive accomplishment facilitated.

Of course there will be objections,—particularly by those legislators who so love to hear themselves talk. But with the proper leadership certainly a majority could be persuaded to agree to such a desirable and common sense program.

And there need be no doubt of this: the people of the state as a whole would back up such an effort 100%!

The Same Old Mars

"Here ye are," he yelled, "git a paper where they don't graduate yuh out 'er college inter de bread line!" and he waved a paper defiantly in one hand.

WE bought one. It was the Soviet Weekly. There was nothing in it about colleges or bread lines. From cover to cover it was a pictorial display of Stalin, in military uniform, with his tanks, motorized artillery, army planes and bombers—

an aggressive military note running through the entire publication. Of course the Soviet answer to all this militarism is "defense." Russia only wants peace, but its enemies better beware.

What is the answer? The answer is, call it what you will, dictatorship leads inevitably to militarism. It may be a dictatorship of a Hitler, a Mussolini, or a Stalin. the net result is the same.

THEORETICALLY Communism is opposed to militarism, the establishment of the dictatorship of the proletariat THROUGH force, only leads to its maintenance BY force, and eventually merely to the establishment of another war machine.

As things are going now it will not be long before Stalin and his Soviet Legions will occupy the same place in European affairs, and represent the same menace to world peace, that the Kaiser and his Imperial Guard did, a generation ago.

HAS WITCH HAZEL MEDICINAL VALUE?

A Kentucky reader, aged 85 years, tells me he sold his car to force him to walk. He says: "I eat heavy, sleep like a log and walk everywhere." Now listen, you marathon runners who take all your oxygen mixed more or less with gasoline, carbon monoxide and the aroma of burning rubber.

By second sight I can tell that the ailing Kentuckian has a good metabolism, and that's worth a great deal in these days of high prices. Walking two miles per hour increases metabolism three times the resting rate. That is so, it makes the body absorb three times as much oxygen as it does when resting.

Waiting in a crowd as metabolism four-fold, as does footrotting. Dancing a mazurka or polka, it was found in the Physiology Institute at Helsinki, Finland, increases metabolism almost tenfold.

SPEED NEWS: A transport plane flies from Angeles to New York in 11 hours and five minutes, breaking the previous record by about a half hour.
