

# Buying Oregon Products Offered as Aid to Business Recovery Here

## COMMONWEALTH STUDENTS SPLIT SCHOOL LABORS

### Half of Day Spent in Class Rooms—Balance Is Devoted to Farming—Life Is Plain, Clothing Scant

MEMPHIS, Ark. — (UP) — Labor and class work divide the time of students at Commonwealth College. Half the day is in the class rooms and the other half is at some task that keeps the co-operative school going.

Students and instructors work side by side in the fields, the print shop, laundry, wood lot, office or library. They all work together to maintain the school that has grown from a meager beginning of 34 cents into an institution that has attracted national attention with its labor activities.

National Topics Discussed  
Discussions of national topics and labor problems occupy evening at the school, according to students.

Work at the school is divided. The women (12 at the time of a legislative investigation) do the house work, the laundry and the office work. The men chop the wood for the open fireplaces, plow and do other heavy work.

Cooking is left to the wife of the college's handy man. The handy man's job is to keep motor equipment repaired, including a dozen or more antiquated motor cars always ready to take students and faculty members to labor centers for practical experience during uprisings.

Furnishings in the school's dormitories are meager with the quarters for the women and instructors the better equipped.

Scant Attire  
Attire of both men and women is scant, farmer neighbors testified to legislative investigators. Nudism is common, they said.

The college commissary or cafeteria is equipped with rough, homemade tables covered with oil cloth and set with heavy and almost unbreakable earthenware. This same room serves as a class-room, auditorium and community center.

No religious services are held under the direction of the school. Neighbors said a search of the 12 buildings would not disclose a single Bible.

Wood-burning stoves and fireplaces furnish heat for the unpainted, frame buildings.

Water is pumped from a large creek which traverses a corner of the campus. This same creek serves as a swimming pool during the summer months and, according to T. J. Thomas, farmer school land renter, is the scene of nude mixed bathing parties.

## POOR POSTURE OF CHILD INJURIOUS

WASHINGTON—(UP) If your child stands with his weight on his ankles and heels, knees slightly bent, head forward, chin out, chest flattened and sunken, and shoulder blades protruding, his posture is poor, says the Children's Bureau of the Labor Department.

The bureau described poor posture in connection with issuance of a new poster entitled "Good Posture in the Little Child." The poster was prepared in response to requests from health and educational agencies.

The child with good posture, the bureau said, "stands at his full height with his weight on the balls of his feet, his head high and chin in. His chest is high and his shoulder blades do not stick out in the back. His abdomen is drawn in. The curves of his back are slight and his knees are straight."

## Natural Pineapple Juice in The Preparation of Salads

Too many women the use of pineapple in a salad suggests some such commonplace combination as a slice of the fruit, a leaf of lettuce and a topping of cream cheese. All three are excellent foods; but there is a new way in which the zestful and appetizing flavor of the Hawaiian fruit can be imparted to salads, and I am sure that all who read this will never regret trying it.

Especially for those who wish to prepare salads that will cause their children and men-folk to sing the praises of their favorite cook, I am suggesting two simple recipes calling for the use of natural, unweetened pineapple juice. (The syrup in which sliced pineapple is packed is excellent in its place, but must not be used in these salads).

**Molded Mayonnaise Salad**  
1 package lemon jello  
1/2 cups boiling Hawaiian pineapple juice  
1 teaspoon salt  
1 dash cayenne  
1/4 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce  
1 cup grated American cheese  
1/2 cup mayonnaise dressing, real thick  
Dissolve jello in boiling pineapple juice, add seasonings, chill until cold and syrupy. Place in a bowl of cracked ice, and whip with egg beater until fluffy and thick like whipped cream. Combine cheese and mayonnaise, and fold into jello. Turn into molds, chill until firm. Serve on crisp endive or chicory, and garnish with radish roses and sweet shakerkins.

**Hawaiian Jelly Salad**  
3 cups solid pack tomatoes  
2 cups Hawaiian pineapple juice  
2 tablespoons gelatine  
1 teaspoon dried thyme  
1 teaspoon salt  
6 cloves  
1/4 bayleaf  
1/2 teaspoon grated onion  
1/2 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce  
Small can of asparagus tips  
In a saucepan place the tomatoes with all of the seasonings and the



water from the can of asparagus. Simmer slowly on the fire for about 30 minutes, or until the tomatoes are very soft, then strain through a fine sieve, pressing through as much of the pulp as possible.

While this is cooking, soak the gelatine in 1/4 cup of the pineapple juice. Over this pour the tomato pulp, which has been heated to the boiling point, and stir until dissolved. Rinse individual molds in cold water, place the asparagus tips in them in regular shapes, then pour in a little of the gelatine mixture and leave in the ice box to harden. As soon as the mixture has set, remove and add more of the gelatine until the mold is full.

Serve on crisp lettuce with mayonnaise or Louis dressing.

## TRIO OF NATIONS IN COMPETITION FOR TRAIN SPEED

### Britain, Germany, Italy Would Gain Credit for World's Fastest Travel by Rail — Lead Is Elusive

LONDON—(UP)—Competition between the leading nations for the world's train speed record is becoming more and more intense.

The lead changes hands almost daily as stream-lined and Diesel-energized locomotives set new records. Facts and figures show that at present Britain runs the fastest steam express train in the world, and that Germany has the fastest train in existence, a Diesel electric express.

**World Steam Record**  
Recently, a British engine, seven years old, pulled a train 268 miles in three hours and 31 minutes, an average of 69.6 miles an hour, and touched at one time the world record for steam of 108 miles an hour.

At the moment a triangular fight between Germany, Italy and Britain, with, respectively, electric, rail-car, and steam trains, is on. Germany is reported to be contemplating something faster than the Flying Hamburger; Italy is developing speedy rail-cars; and Britain is pinning her faith to steam, plus stream-lining.

**Non-Stop Record**  
Apart from the Cheltenham Flyer, which daily covers the 77 1/2 miles from Swindon to London in 63 minutes, Britain holds the world's record for long non-stop journeys. In the summer the record is held by the Flying Scotsman, London to Edinburgh, 392 1/2 miles, while throughout the year the Royal Scot runs non-stop between Carlisle and London, 269 miles.

The general speed-up of trains ac-

cess in Britain has, within the last three years, resulted in a total saving 49,673 minutes daily. There are 31 British expresses scheduled for part of their journeys at start-to-stop speeds of 60 m.p.h. or over, and 53 at 58 m.p.h. or over.

## TOO MUCH NOISE BAD FOR NERVES

BALTIMORE—(UP)—When a boss yells at his secretary, blame it on too much noise, Harold R. Berlin, New York, told the Engineers' club here.

Too much sound, Berlin said, will make a man nervous, raise his blood pressure, and cause indigestion. And, he added, undue din strains the nervous system and helps to lower efficiency of an office force.

Berlin said experts now are studying closely the condition in offices and factories. He said the study of sound has become an important branch of engineering along with air-conditioning and heating.

In certain halls and theaters, the engineer pointed out, the highest priced seats often are the worst acoustically.

## JESSE JAMES' GRAVE STILL DRAWS TOURISTS

KEARNEY, Mo. (UP)—Although 33 years have passed since Jesse James, the bandit, was killed, tourists still stop here to visit his grave and chip off pieces of the monument for souvenirs.

Because the stone was being defaced, relatives took it away, and only the base remains to mark the grave of the old-time outlaw. James was shot to death by one of his own gang, Bob Ford, on April 3, 1882. Ford, impelled by the \$10,000 reward offered by the state for James' "death or alive," shot him down in the back when James took off his gun and mounted a chair to hang a picture in his house in St. Joseph.
