## PORTLAND, ASTORIA WORKMEN QUIT TO ENFORCE DEMAND

The Inman-Poulsen mill with 240 employees; the Portland Lumber company, employing 200 men, and the Johnson Lumber company, with 150 workers.  
A report was received from Westport this morning that the 150 employees of the Westport Lumber company had quit, but company officials denied this. They said a breakdown in equipment had compelled closing over the week-end but that the mill would resume operations Monday.  
Alarmed by the spread of the mill workers' strike, Chief of Police Harry Niles today added 30 more men to the police strike detail and announced all members of the department will be put on a 12-hour shift with no days off.  
The Oregon state police announced that four of their cars each carrying two men, will start patrol work on a 12-hour shift tonight. The city accepted the offer of the Multnomah county sheriff to authorize three county patrol cars to strike duty 24 hours a day.  
The city police strike detail now numbers 90 men.

**Excursion Flights Will Be Continued**  
The recent passenger flights over this city have proven so popular that Tom Culbertson, airport manager, has decided to continue them, and arrangements for regular flights have been made. The flights will continue until further notice.  
Culbertson stated that a Travelair observation plane, and a Waco reconnaissance plane, both semi-enclosed, two passenger ships, will be used, and the same nominal fee that has prevailed this week will be charged. Department of commerce licensed pilots will fly the ships. The thrill of flying in a semi-enclosed plane, Culbertson stated, is far superior to that experienced in closed models.
