MANY AUTO DRIVERS DEPRIVED OF CARDS

SALEM, May 9.—(AP)—Revocations and suspensions of motor vehicle operators' licenses passed the hundred mark during April, as 67 licenses were revoked and 34 suspended, the motor vehicle division of the state department reported today.

Driving while intoxicated resulted in 64 of the revocations and manslaughter in one. Sixteen of the suspensions were for reckless driving. Convictions for violation of the state traffic laws last month totaled 1664.

CHEVROLET STRIKERS VOTE ON PEACE PLAN

TOLEDO, O., May 9.—(AP)—Crowds of Chevrolet Motor company employees thronged the federal building here Wednesday to vote on a series of company proposals, the acceptance of which would possibly mean an end of the widespread group of auto workers' strikes.

Approximately 39,000 employees of the Chevrolet and Fisher body companies, both General Motors subsidiaries, who are out of work in several cities because of strikes or shutdowns waited for the result of the balloting.
