BOY SCOUT JAMBOREE AT ASHLAND PROMISES MANY NEW FEATURES

ASHLAND, May 15.—(Sp.)—Plans are developing rapidly for a unified community-wide entertainment to be given in the local armory Friday night for the benefit of two Boy Scout jamborees in Washington, D. C., next August...

EX-WEYERHAEUSER PRESIDENT PASSES

TACOMA, May 15.—(AP)—J. P. Weyerhaeuser, 78, former president of the Weyerhaeuser Timber company, died of pneumonia at 2:30 o'clock this morning.

He was born in Coal Valley, Illinois, on November 4, 1858, the son of Frederick Weyerhaeuser, founder of the timber company bearing his name.

Later the Weyerhaeuser interests were centered in St. Paul, where young J. P. Weyerhaeuser lived for some years.

The Weyerhaeusers entered the lumbering field on the west coast at about the turn of the century and Weyerhaeuser removed to Tacoma in 1914.

Mrs. E. Richardson of Richmond, Va., field secretary for the National Federation of Business and Professional Women's Clubs, was a guest in Medford Wednesday evening at a meeting of the local women's organization.

"The discrimination against women in business which has increased during the past three years, particularly in California," was discussed by Mrs. Richardson, who outlined plans of the National B. and P. W. to meet this situation.

She told about intervening President Roosevelt concerning the problem of unemployment among women following the establishment of CCC camps for men.

Mrs. Richardson pointed out that since the depression there has been a growing prejudice against women on payrolls. It being more necessary than ever for some of them to be employed now, the national women's organization as a body will endeavor to carry out some constructive program in this connection.

Mrs. Leona Bryant of Coquille, Ore., state membership chairman for the Federation of National Business and Professional Women's Clubs, motored to Medford yesterday to join Mrs. Richardson on a trip to The Dalles, where they will attend a state convention of their organization this week end.

Before arriving in Medford, Mrs. Richardson had traveled through practically every state in the United States except Montana.

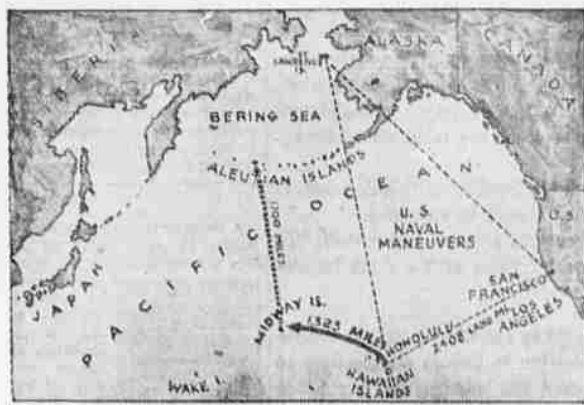

TEACHER'S DEATH ACCIDENT, BELIEF

McMINNVILLE, Ore., May 15.—(AP) The theory of accidental drowning gained more or less general credence today as police and friends of the family continued their investigation into the death of Miss Florence Groth, 21, Lafayette grade school teacher, whose body was found Tuesday in the Yamhill river.

Sheriff George W. Manning and Sergeant Greifell of state police said they believed, after a new investigation, the girl had accidentally fallen from a bridge. The sheriff and the coroner earlier had inclined to the suicide theory.

The family of the girl has expressed belief that Miss Groth was killed by thieves who raided the Groth home; that she recognized them and that she was knocked from the boat landing into the stream when she surprised the raiders. A bruise such as might have been caused by a blow from a fist, was found on the girl's temple.
