INSPECTORS RATE GUARD COMPANIES HERE IN TOP RANK

Annual federal inspection report of the two local National Guard companies, Co. A and Headquarters company, has just been received from headquarters Ninth Corps Area, Presidio, San Francisco, and the highest rating possible to attain has been accorded both companies. The reports cover all phases of training for the past year and go into considerable detail.

Comments of the inspecting officer, Major Dennis C. Pillsbury, Infantry, U. S. A., include the following remarks pertaining to Company A: "A well trained rifle company, which reflects good leadership. Administration is conscientiously conducted. Care of property is excellent. Morale is high. Officers and non-commissioned officers show energy and enthusiasm in their work. Troops show systematic training and discipline." Similar high words of praise were expressed regarding Headquarters company.

Company A, 189th Infantry, is commanded by Captain Carl Y. Tene-wald, assisted by First Lieut. Weldon H. McBee and Second Lieut. Bruce W. Moffatt. Headquarters company, 3rd Battalion, 189th Infantry, is commanded by First Lieut. James W.

Grigsby, assisted by Second Lieut. Ord W. Reed. Both organizations will leave on June 10th for Camp Lewis, Washington, for the annual encampment. This year's camp will be in conjunction with the troops from Washington, Montana and Idaho, and will be the largest concentration of National Guard troops in 10 years.

plished for him personally. Davis was so interested that he suggested the farmer go around and tell other farmers about his experience. The farmer was put on the AAA payroll for that purpose and is now out making speeches.

Without saying anything about it, the new deal seems to have scrapped the idea of spending relief money for the manufacture of goods. President Roosevelt himself is supposed to have ordered discontinuance of the practice.

Under the old relief set-up, money was spent to make mattresses in Ohio, shoes in some other sections, etc. Some complained bitterly about the competition.

A new project was recently put forth by Congressman Copney of Massachusetts to spend \$25,000,000 of relief money for making shoes. He was turned down on the ground that the government is not doing that sort of thing any more.

The next issue of Labor, a forceful newspaper issued by the railroad brotherhood, will contain a charge that Supreme Court Justice Roberts was on the J. P. Morgan preferred list. The brotherhood boys have dug up evidence from a record of the senate banking committee indicating

that Mr. Roberts was on a Morgan list for 100 shares of Allegheny corporation common stock. This was long before Mr. Morgan became a supreme court justice and while he was an attorney in Philadelphia.

The reason the brotherhood was twisting the matter is because Mr. Roberts led the majority of the court in the recent opinion investigating the pension law.

The secret of the popularity of the farm program with many farmers may be found in some of the AAA statistics. There are 3,000,000 farmers subscribing to AAA contracts. Payments to the cotton farmers amounted to \$24,418,979 to the end of March. The AAA expects to pay about \$100,000,000 to cotton farmers this year, as compared with \$116,000,000 paid to them last year.

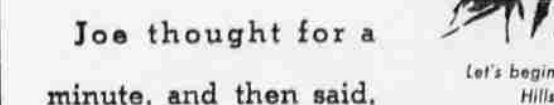
