ENRIGHT FREEDOM DUE SATURDAY IF \$100 FINE IS PAID

T. J. Enright, attorney, under a 90-day jail sentence and \$100 fine, for circuit court conviction of driving an auto while intoxicated, will be freed next Saturday if the \$100 fine is paid, Sheriff Syd I. Brown said today.

Enright, during his confinement, according to the sheriff, has been a model prisoner, serving most of the time as kitchen trustee and has made himself generally useful about the bastille.

Last week Enright was granted permission to appear as counsel in the hearing on the interpleader suit of Niedermeyer, Inc. before Circuit Judge Carl Wimberly of Douglas county.

A number of applications by Enright for parole were denied by Circuit Judge Norton.

The "grievance committee" of the Southern Oregon Bar association is reported to have this case under consideration, but has taken no public action.

Previous to his circuit court conviction, Enright was found guilty of a drunken driving charge in justice court and sentenced to 30 days in the county jail and fined \$100 and costs. The jail sentence was suspended and the cost paid in this case.

SIX FLIERS KILLED IN MID-SEA CRASH NAVAL REVELATION

from the unprecedented maneuvers to eight, seven of whom died in airplane crashes. The eighth was killed in the collision of two destroyers. Three airplanes have been lost in mid-Pacific during the maneuvers, and four destroyers damaged in three collisions.

The 67P, one of the giant bombing patrol planes that made the first hazardous flight from Hawaii to Midway Island, crashed at night 50 miles south of Midway and 4,000 miles from the Pacific coast.

She had pulled out of a tight formation to call nearby surface craft to the rescue of her sister ship, the 6710 which had been forced to land on the heavy seas. It was while circling over the 6710 during the night that something suddenly went wrong—no one knew what—and the huge bomber crashed into the ocean apparently in full flight.

All that remained of the craft when found was her smashed gas tank, a shattered wing tip and seat cushion.
