

PARENTS OF GIRL CAUSE ARREST OF ROSEBURG VISITOR

ROSEBURG, Ore., May 24.—(AP)—Jack McGee of Tecopa, California, was arrested at Myrtle Creek Thursday and returned to Roseburg to answer to a charge of contributing to the delinquency of a minor. Charges against McGee were brought by the parents of a 16-year-old girl, not named by the police, after the girl had disappeared from her home in company with McGee Tuesday night.

She returned home early Thursday and police learned that McGee had been seen travelling south and succeeded in having him stopped at Myrtle Creek.

According to a report from Sheriff Percy Webb, McGee told officers that he had taken the girl to Portland for a surgical operation but found no physician willing to perform the service. He returned her to her home and attempted to continue into California. He is also reported by the officers to have said he and the girl had planned to marry as soon as he could complete a divorce now pending in Reno, Nevada. The girl is in custody of the juvenile court.

EGYPT ALSO HAD ITS UNDERWORLD

PARIS (UP)—Another scandal of the administration of justice has been reported here. This time controversy between high magistrates and grave robbers. It is charged that dictatorial procedure and failure to push prosecutions allowed the robbers to continue their activities, to their profit as well as to that of the negligent judges.

The affair was unearthed by J. Capart, director of the Royal Museums of Belgium, who reported it to the Paris Academy of Inscriptions. He found the details inscribed on an Egyptian papyrus which he had discovered which demonstrated that in the sixteenth year of the reign of Ramses IX corrupt justice was as lenient with the desecrators of the tombs of the Pharaohs of Thebes as more modern judges are sometimes accused of being with contemporary offenders.

The bad state of the papyrus unfortunately did not allow the Academy of Inscriptions to discover whether Egypt punished her erring magistrates in a barbarous outdated manner, or whether she was sufficiently civilized to follow the present enlightened method of promoting them to higher positions.

ROSEBURG CHOSEN FOR IOOF CONFAB

SALEM, May 24.—(AP)—Circuit Judge Howard K. Zimmerman of Astoria was elected grand warden of the grand lodge I. O. O. F. in the closing minutes of the four-day lodge convention here yesterday, defeating Neiland R. Gilbert of Bend after a dozen ballots had been taken.

The lodge had recessed earlier in the day when the vote for grand warden was deadlocked, after choosing Roseburg for the 1936 convention city and electing all other officers.

F. M. Sexton of The Dalles progressed to master, succeeding Charles P. Poole of Eugene, who became grand representative to the sovereign lodge at Atlantic City. Other officers elected were Roy H. Gibbs of Gresham, deputy grand master; William A. Morand, Portland, re-elected secretary; J. H. Nelson, McMinnville, re-elected grand treasurer; R. G. Henderson of Clatskanie, re-elected trustee to the home board, and J. B. Swan of Portland, re-elected grand trustee.

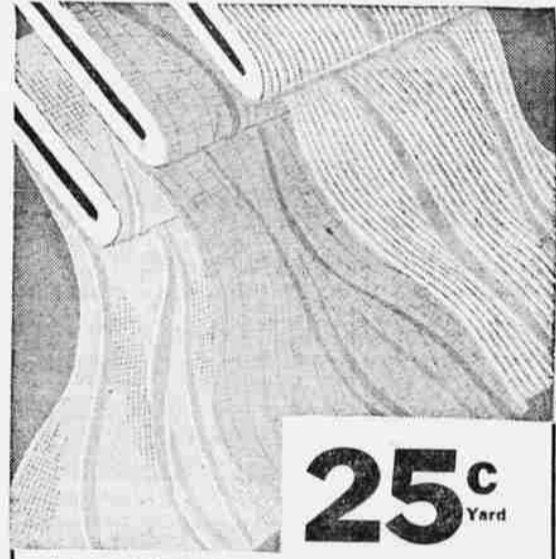
