

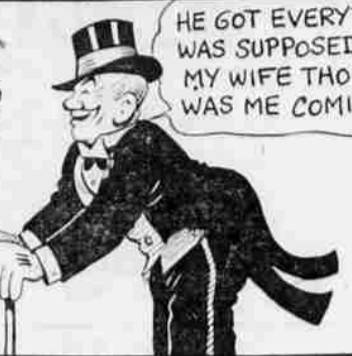
# MUTT AND JEFF
