HULSE TO ENTER PLEA WEDNESDAY

Ferry Alonso (Joe) Hulse, 54, Sterling district prosecutor, charged with threatening to commit a felony, was arraigned in circuit court this morning and given until tomorrow morning to enter a plea. The court named Attorney Frank J. Van Dyke of Ashland to defend Hulse. The defendant later yesterday asked permission to change his plea to guilty, authorities say.

The complaint alleges that Hulse, with a rifle in his hands, threatened State Policeman Ed Walker with the words, "I'll kill you," and "other words of like import," during a chance meeting in the timber a month ago. Trooper Walker prevailed upon Hulse to abandon his dire purpose.

According to the evidence in the case the state policeman while on a tour of inspection came upon Hulse' auto parked on a wooded road. Hulse, as soon as he sighted him is alleged to have made the threats in a violent outbreak.

The case was among those scheduled to be investigated by the new grand jury drawn yesterday.


