### ENGRAVER PLIES TRADE AS GUNS BLAST AT SHOOT

A man who sits calmly at a little table in front of the Medford Gun club has turned out to be one of the main attractions for spectators attending the state trapshoot. There is always an avid group about him and he doesn't mind the attention he receives in the least. Not only does he work as you lean over his shoulder; he will even carry on a conversation as he toils at his art.

The man is W. A. Crum and he is an engraver by profession. He is here to engrave in steel the names and addresses of winners upon their guns.

It is a novel occupation, it is said, and only a rare few follow it.

Mr. Crum has been following all the major trapshoots in this country, Canada and Mexico since 1928. He does the engraving free hand and in ten minutes he can cut a name and address into the hard steel of a gun.

He moves from one meet to the next with his family and while he is out on the coast he is planning to visit his brother, C. D. Crum, who resides in Portland.

Mr. Crum has engraved the name of many shotgun celebrities upon their favorite weapons, including Ted Renfro, the internationally famous scatter-gunner, who is participating in the Medford tournament; Frank Thob, Oregon state singles champion, also here; Mark Aris, Joe Hiestand, Gus Payne and Sam Sherman.

He has also engraved the guns of Governor Morley Griswold of Nevada and Governor Vic Donahey of Ohio. Mr. Crum's home state, his residence being in Columbus. Last year at the Reno meet he engraved Mayor Geo. W. Porter's gun and today he cut the name of Medford's chief executive upon another weapon.

Although Mr. Crum estimates he has engraved more than 10,000 guns, he had never owned any kind of a firearm himself until last year when Police Chief W. L. Payne of Salt Lake City presented him with a pistol.

The pistol, now engraved with fancy scrolls as an example of his own art, may be seen on Mr. Crum's work table.
