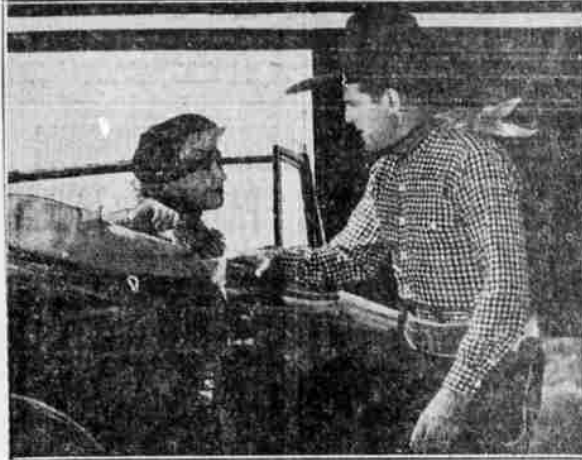
Here Sunday

JAIL 90 RADICALS AFTER WILD MELEE AT HOLMES MILL

Hitherto, the strikers, who are said to constitute less than 10 per cent of the 400 men employed by the Holmes-Eureka company, have pursued peaceful methods. At other points, northward along the Pacific coast to Oregon and Washington, the lumber strike has resulted in several outbreaks but today's episode was the first of the kind in Humboldt county, center of northern California lumbering activity.

PORTLAND, Ore., June 21.—(AP)—Hope that differences leading to the northwest lumber strike would soon be ironed out grew today with the announcement that a sawmill in the lower Columbia area would re-open Monday and that 10 small logging operations in the same sector already had resumed work. Negotiations for the re-opening of other mills and camps were declared by union leaders to be in progress, and while no official confirmation has been forthcoming reports persist that several Portland operators will place men at work next week. Managers of the nine Portland plants which advertised for workers early this week said about 1200 applications had been received. Sixty per cent, they said, were from former employees. In the meantime, however, no word from the labor temple had been issued which would lead to the belief that the 2000 men who cheered their leaders' plea to "stand pat" Wednesday night had altered their views.
