

**FATHER AND SON HANG FOR SLAYING OFFICER**

ST. THOMAS, Ont., June 28.—(AP)—A father and his son, shielded from the rain by tarpaulins and

guarded from the glances of the curious by a line of policemen, died on the gallows behind the walls of Elgin county jail today for the murder of a policeman. Rather than have the younger face a year-old bicycle-theft charge, Frank, 52, and his son, Fred Temple, 21, alias MacTemple, killed a policeman May 7, 1934.

**SALEM BOARD PLANS NEW SCHOOL HOUSES**

SALEM, Ore., June 27.—(UP)—A \$1,000,000 building and remodeling

program will be discussed by the Salem school board and a committee of bankers and civic leaders, on Friday, July 5. The plan, recommended by Dr. C. L. Huffaker of the University of Oregon school of education, is to replace the four "fire-trap" wooden grade school buildings with two-story semi-fireproof structures and build a new
