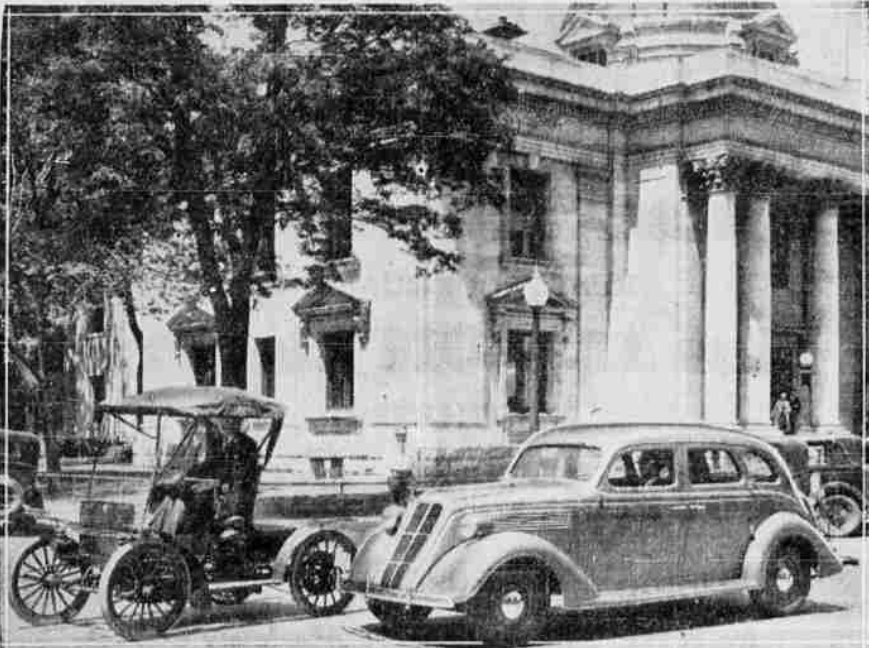

COUNTY GETS BEER TAX PAYMENTS ON PER CAPITA RATE

SALEM, Ore., June 29.—(AP) Cities and counties will receive privilege tax returns under the 1935 liquor law at the rate of 2 cents per capita. It was announced by the secretary of state today. The returns are for the current year up to the end of June. A total of 87,943 barrels of beer has been sold since the new act became effective raising the tax to \$1.30 a barrel. Of this sum cities and counties receive 30 cents per barrel or a total of \$19,479. Under the act, passed by the 1935 legislature, the privilege tax also includes 10 per cent of the revenue from wines and other alcoholic beverages outside hard liquors. The total tax collected for wines was \$21,893.

ALASKA PIONEERS GIVEN CREDIT, NEW COMMISSARY HEAD

PALMER, Alaska, June 29.—(AP)—A "house cleaning" for the Matanuska colonization project, the first step a complete reorganization of the commissary, was in full swing today. Eugene Carr, federal relief administrator, "trouble shooter," took over full authority and things began to hum. The reorganization of the commissary, started by Irwin, was under way with the manager removed and a number of colonists checking over the accounts. Already prices on numerous articles have been cut and the giving of sales slips on merchandise has been introduced. The six dissatisfied families who have decided to return to the states were selling their things today to straighten out their bills. They will start the first of the week. Other families have said they would also join them. One of the colonists commented that "things in the commissary must be straightened out immediately, even if a double force must be put to work for a while. It's no sense in running a business as this has been run." Some families have run large bills, one large family having a bill of more than \$500 in less than two months. Other colonists report having been charged for items they never bought.

DEISEL CAR GOES 520 MILES ON 98C

OMAHA, June 29.—(AP)—C. L. Cummins, builder of the Diesel auto, making a leisurely attempt to cross the nation on 98 worth of fuel, today named Choyenne as his next objective. He arrived here last night, boasting the 520 mile trip from Chicago was made for 98 cents. "We're \$3.19 out of New York," said Cummins, who was accompanied by Fred Duesenberg. "We burned 14 gallons of distillate to average 36 miles an hour from Chicago."
