

MAN GOES TO TRIAL IN ASSERTED TRIANGLE KILLING



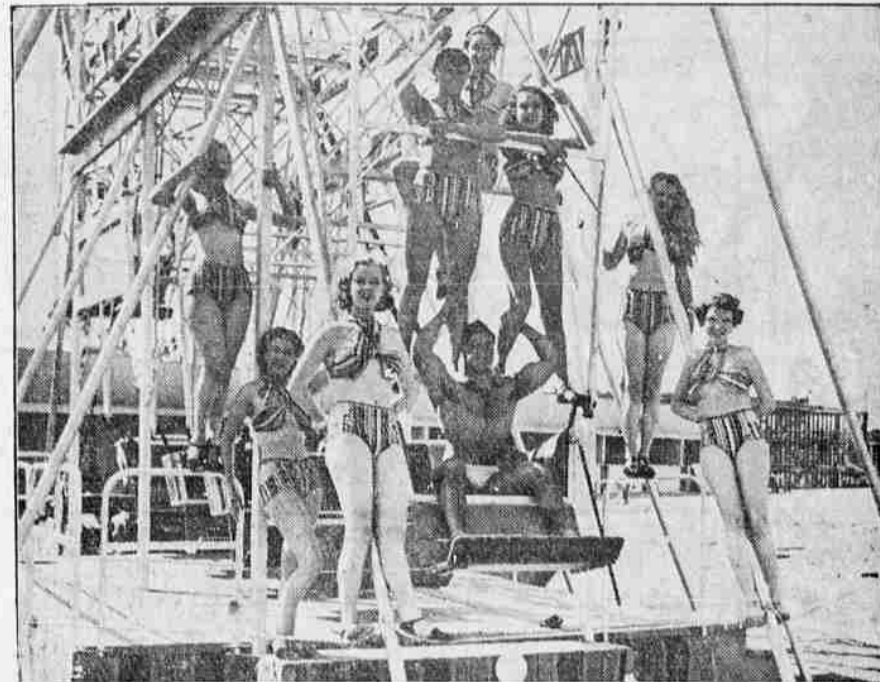

JOHNSON FALTERS NEAR TAPE IN WILD FINISH



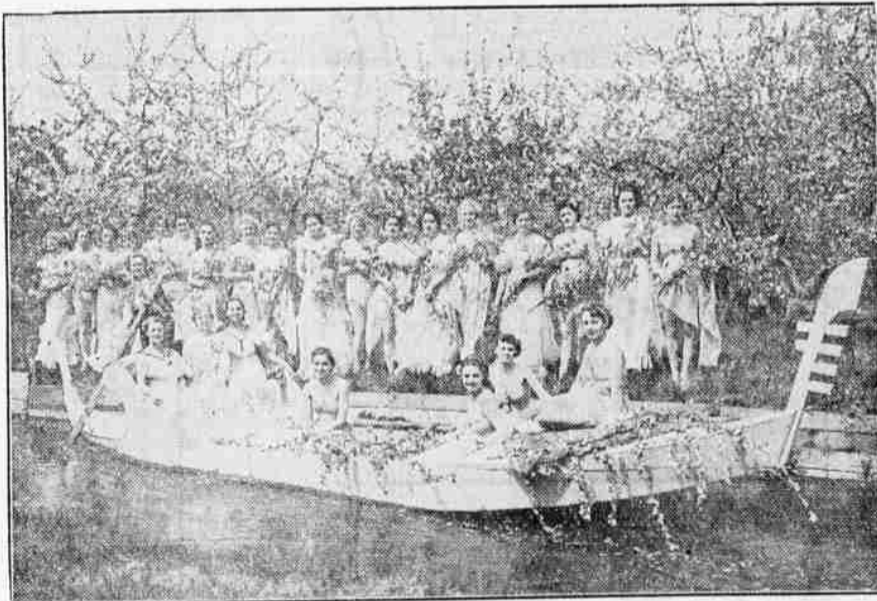

ARMY AMPHIBIANS LAND ON NEW BOULDER LAKE



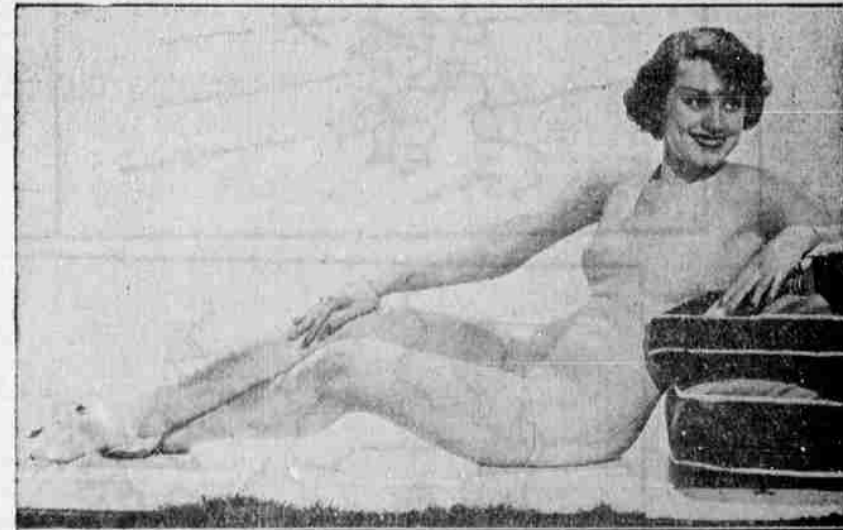
