MEEHAN HANDLES HUPMOBILE LINE SOUTHERN OREGON

J. B. Meehan, well known resident of southern Oregon for the past 30 years, has been appointed dealer for Hupmobile automobiles for southern Oregon, according to a recent announcement. Mr. Meehan's headquarters will be maintained on route one near this city although temporary display rooms will be established at 21 South Front street where the newest Hupmobile models will be displayed for a limited time, beginning Monday.

The series 521 Hupmobile has a six cylinder engine developing 161 horsepower, and a wheelbase of 121 inches. Hupmobile's basic streamlining smooths out the air, eliminates wind roar and rear vacuum, and permits a redistribution of weight and passenger load that gives maximum riding comfort.

MAN, 95, KILLED FOR \$30; FATHER AND SON QUIZZED

VANCOUVER, Wash., July 6.—(AP)—The strangled body of Louis D. Boucher, 95, who disappeared June 18, was found late today in the Columbia river 12 miles below here. Although the body was somewhat decomposed, Sheriff Leland F. Morrow identified the toothless form by the white, grizzled beard and the thin thatch of hair. Sheriff Morrow at once took Fred Jones, about 60, and his son Orville Jones, into custody for questioning.

They live on property near the Boucher place which is about eight miles east of here. Boucher disappeared at night and a purse believed to contain \$30, and his cane also were missing. His every-day clothes, with the exception of his underwear, were found in his cabin.

The body when found was clothed in overalls and a shirt which appeared to have been hastily pulled on and which were not buttoned, Sheriff Morrow said.

BONNEVILLE SALE BILL CONSIDERED

WASHINGTON, July 6.—(AP)—Senator McNary (R., Ore.) said today a bill was under consideration in administration circles to provide for sale of surplus power on the \$36,000,000 Bonneville dam project on Columbia river, Oregon. The dam is scheduled for completion in 1936.

Written along the lines of the power provisions of the Boulder dam act, the measure would provide for disposition to states, counties, municipalities, cooperation organization and private corporations of the surplus power not needed for operation of navigation facilities, at wholesale under contracts for terms up to 25 years.

BUS DRIVER LIKE CAPTAIN AT SEA, COURT CONTENTS

PORTLAND, July 6.—(AP)—A bus driver, while on his job, has all the authority of a ship captain, including the right to order unruly passengers to leave the deck. Such in substance was the opinion of Circuit Judge James W. Crawford yesterday in sentencing Palmo Bernardi to five months in the county

jail on charges of stabbing John H. Hayertz, bus driver, of Portland. The stabbing was declared to have taken place after Hayertz had ordered Bernardi to leave the bus when the latter allegedly became unruly. An argument over a nickel change preceded the fracas. A bus driver is responsible for the preservation of peace, just as is a ship captain, Judge Crawford said in upholding Hayertz' action in ordering Bernardi to leave the vehicle.

SEA POWER PLAN OF HITLER TOLD LEADING NATIONS

BERLIN, July 6.—(AP)—Five great world powers knew tonight what was being kept carefully from the people of Germany—the Reich's detailed program of naval construction for 1935-36.

Under the pledge of secrecy military attaches of Great Britain, the United States, France, Japan and Italy were told last night exactly what tonnage the Germany navy has and will have at the end of 1936, what categories of ships she has built, is building and intends to build, and what submarines and speedboats are under construction or planned.

Secrecy was maintained as to the contents of the communication, but an authoritative source said it was merely in the nature of a notification without any suggestions to those informed that they make known their own positions. It was taken for granted in diplomatic circles, however, that the "notification" was in the nature of a "build-up" for Reichsfuehrer Hitler's endeavor to obtain a general naval agreement among the governments primarily interested in sea power.

Air Drill Starts SALEM, July 6.—(AP)—A month's training for aviation reserve officers of Oregon and Washington will be held at Vancouver, Wash., and at Albany, Ore., beginning Sunday. Governor Martin announced today. More than 25 men will participate in the federal camp.
