While looking through some of our automobile pamphlets we came upon some on the "Delage." This is a French car which has won quite an outstanding name for itself in the world of speed. In 1932 on the famous Monthery speed track it broke six speed records. It maintained an average speed of better than 117 miles per hour for six hours! (However, per hour for six hours.) The records were broken last year by the Pierce-Arrow which was driven by Ab Jenkins. It averaged 123 miles per hour for the first 1,000 miles and better than 117 for the full 2,000 miles. The particular Delage model that made those records is known as the D 8-S. It is an eight-cylinder special model built primarily for fast touring. But, according to their literature, speed was not their only objective when they designed these cars. They also gave serious consideration to comfort and ease of handling. The car has 130 inches of wheelbase which is ample for passenger comfort but which is also short enough to give comparatively good maneuverability. As we understand it, this car is also equipped with independently sprung front wheels. A transverse spring is used in front, while the conventional type of spring is used for the rear. With this combination of wheelbase and springing the car should be stable to take the roughest bumps with ease.

These cars may be had with various types of bodies, all of which are either two or four seaters. The roadster is especially interesting. It is equipped with the most streamlined fenders and the rear of the body is nicely sloping and pointed. But, in contrast to all of the streamline effects, is the radiator, which is flat and straight up and down. There isn't even so much as a slight V in it to split the wind. That is a feature which we cannot understand about so many foreign cars. They will have everything on the car very streamlined except the radiator, and it sticks out like a sore thumb. Another very novel body is the "fixed head" four-window coupe. This coupe has two windows on each side but does not have any post between them. They work like this. The window in the door winds up and down like the conventional car window, but the quarter window behind it slides back and forth instead of up and down. With this feature the driver and passengers may obtain a full and unobstructed view. We are sure this idea would be a great advantage in crowded city traffic where unobstructed vision is very essential.

Car of Tomorrow will be Grown, says Ford

The former inmate of the Ohio hospital for the insane identified the hammer he used to kill the Gallagher girl, and other gruesome exhibits in the case.

Prosecutor Duncan C. McCrea said Goodrich would be arraigned Monday and that he would continue to question both Goodrich and his wife in the meantime.

"I have only one regret," Goodrich said, "that I will lose my wife forever."

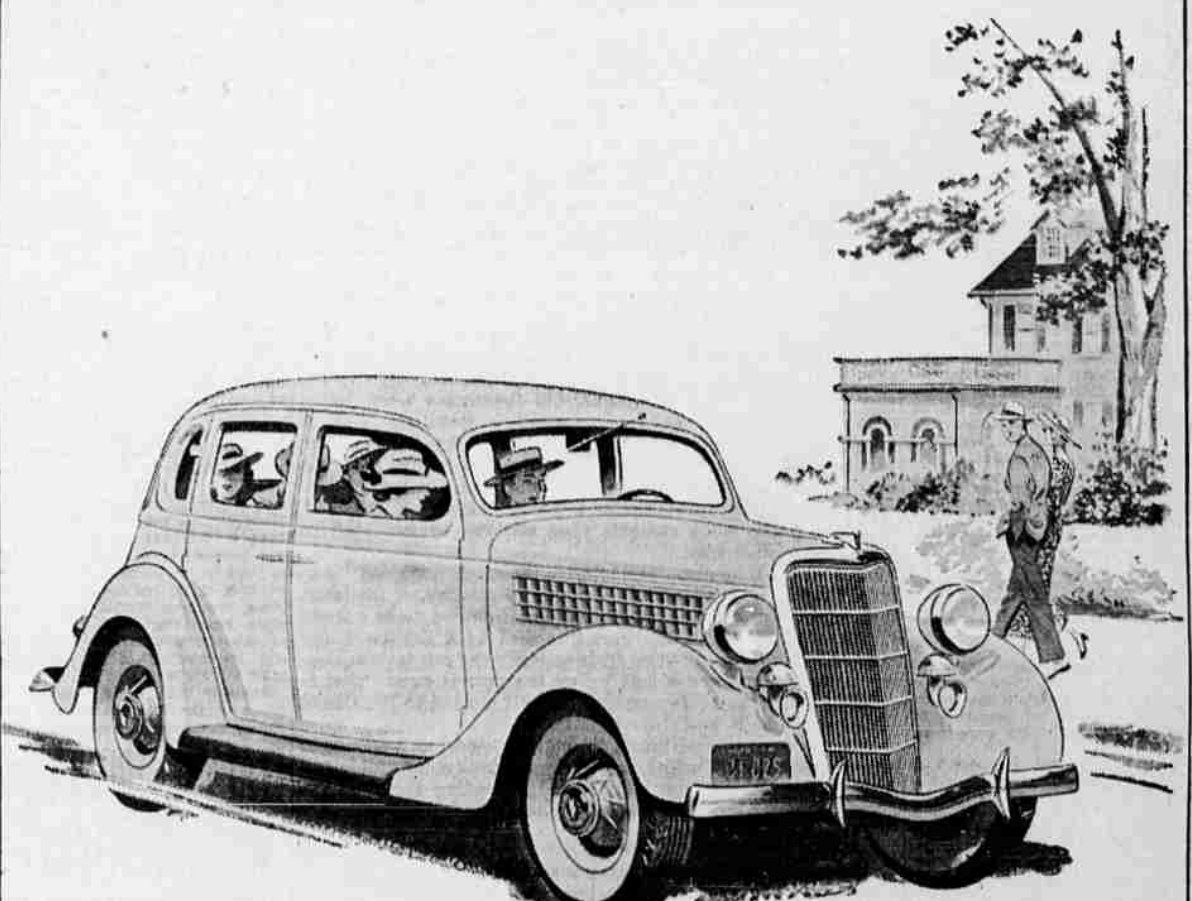
BOYS TREE LIONS; CROWD IN PANIC
