

COUNTY'S RELIEF SPENDING HELD IN BUDGETS BOUNDS

Relief expenditures in Jackson county for the six months period ending June 30 last, total \$40,389.86, according to the report of the county clerk's office. The expenditures are well within the budget allowance of approximately \$52,000,000 for all relief allotments.

Relief expenditures for the month of June, amounted to \$9,768.36. A decrease in the two main items—hospitalization and miscellaneous relief—is expected for the next three months because of the decline in sickness, and increased seasonal occupations.
