

SPRANGER'S BODY FOUND IN ROGUE AFTER 4 MONTHS

Investigators, approaching the spot in a boat. The body was about 60 feet from the shore.

Although the corpse was in advanced stages of decomposition from being submerged, it was identified by an upper plate in the mouth that had four broken teeth. Dick McCoy, of Gold Hill, who had lived with Spranger shortly before the tragedy, first identified the body by its few remaining articles of clothing.

Spranger was drowned when he jumped from the capsizing barge after it had broken from a cable on which he had attempted to shift its position in the river, according to August Mickelson, a mining partner who was a witness from the shore.

Authorities believe the dead man's clothing became entangled in weeds or rocks at the bottom of a deep pool below the rapids, and that with decomposition it came to the surface, but recently and floated downstream.

Spranger is survived by a sister, Mrs. Louise Stein of 909 Ishlam street, Grants Pass. Interment was made in the Medford I. O. O. F. cemetery.

FINE NUDE DANCER \$3.30 IN FRANCE

PARIS, July 18.—(AP)—Joan Warner, the blonde American dancer, was found guilty today of "outraging the morals" of Paris and was fined 50 francs—\$3.30.

Miss Warner did her "outraging" by dancing in the nude. The decision against the American made a basis for a widespread prosecution of all nude dancers in theatres and night clubs here.

Judge Rebraster decided: "Miss Warner's dance is artistic but too naked."

M. Fraudrin, manager of the club where Joan danced, was fined 200 francs—about \$13—because of his "purely commercial spirit."

The costs of the trial multiplied the fines eightfold.

The judge said Miss Warner's "prowd and point somewhat masked her nakedness, but the single article Miss Warner wore concealed very little."

BONNEVILLE SALE OF POWER AGREED

WASHINGTON, July 18.—(AP)—President Roosevelt and sides reached an understanding today for sale of power from the Bonneville dam in Oregon by the power commission.

Senator McNary (R., Ore.) who participated in the White House meeting, will introduce legislation to permit the sale of power.

The White House understandings provided that the war department shall complete work on the dam and make the contracts for power sales, but the power commission is to fix the rates on a basis of amortizing the cost of the dam construction in 80 years.

BOY'S NECK BROKEN BY SHALLOW DIVE

GRANTS PASS, July 18.—(AP)—Still unconscious and reported in a serious condition, Floyd Clark of Glendale was in a hospital here today with a broken neck.

The youth, a medical student at the University of Oregon, broke his neck when he dived into too shallow water at a swimming party near his home Wednesday evening. He was rushed here by ambulance.

BOYS REPRIMANDED FOR SETTING GRASS FIRES

Two small boys were taken into juvenile court today. Five Chief Roy Elliott reported, and reprimanded for setting a grass fire on East Jackson street. There were no charges filed and the youths were turned over to their parents, but Chief Elliott pointed out that the incident might have resulted in a serious offense, and warned the public that it is punishable by a reformatory sentence.

GOERING ORDERS ADDED PRESSURE UPON CATHOLICS

BERLIN, July 18.—(AP)—Gen. Hermann Wilhelm Goering, minister of aviation and commander of Germany's secret police, today issued an order to criminal prosecution authorities to enforce strictly the existing decrees against "political Catholics."

Goering said this Catholicism "must be overcome by positive national socialism."

Foreshadowing the end of all Catholic youth organizations, he stressed the important task which the Hitler youth movement faces in the present clash between the philosophies of life.

Today's decree said: "The minister emphatically demands that all authorities promote the Hitler youth organizations." It continued with a claim that Goering, now as before, rejects the idea of a cultural fight against the Roman Catholic church, but said "all means will be invoked against those Catholic priests who misuse their religious authority."

The order follows shortly after a bitter protest by the Catholic church against the sterilization law, the restriction of Catholic youth organizations, and the use of Rosenberg's paganistic book "The Mystery of the Twentieth Century," as often causing

WALEY DETAINEE ERASES HOPE OF PAROLE ACTION

SEATTLE, July 18.—(AP)—Harmon Metz Waley faced 45 years in prison today without hope of parole, an official source revealed, because department of justice urged the filing of a Washington state detainer against the confessed Weyerhaeuser kidnaper.

The source said that department of justice agents shortly before his wife, Mrs. Margaret Thulin Waley, was convicted in Tacoma last week of kidnapping and conspiring to kidnap George Weyerhaeuser, 9, of Tacoma, told Garfield Davis, parole officer, that they desired him to file the detainer.

Davis said the detainer, charging Waley with parole violation, was telegraphed last night to Alcatraz federal prison where he was confined yesterday. The detainer will prevent Waley being paroled after serving one-third of his sentence, but he may be freed after 30 years for "good conduct."

Satisfied with her fate and looking forward only to the time she can rejoin her husband, Mrs. Waley, 19, sat in the city jail in Tacoma awaiting transfer to the federal women's detention farm at Milan, Mich., where she must serve a maximum of 20 years for the kidnaping of May 24.

IMPERIAL VALLEY HAS HOTTEST DAY

LOS ANGELES, July 18.—(AP)—A scorching sun, intensified by winds, shattered a 1935 heat record in Imperial valley today with a mark of 118 degrees as temperatures along the southern California coast line broke under cooling ocean breezes.

At Calexico, where the mercury reached the season's high, the humidity was pushed up to more than 80 per cent. After temperatures above 100 most of the night, 110 degrees was soon topped today for the ninth consecutive day.

According to word received here by Mrs. Mary E. Graves, local branch secretary of the League of Western Writers, from Judge L. D. Mahone, president, the program for the international league convention to be held in Medford, August 8 to 10, is nearing completion.

Speaking of the organization, Mrs. Graves said:

"The League of Western Writers has maintained a very high standard of membership since organization. Requirements are such that those who could qualify must have had some experience in the writing game. At present there are 12 colleges and universities represented in its membership and on its various boards, giving of their time to render a service to the western states which could be done in no other way. The majority of these schools will be represented on the program to be given in this city. These men and women are coming not only to speak on the regular program, but to be used by the city and surrounding country for such use as may be found. Noon-day lunch clubs, church gatherings, school activities and programs of any make-up can be supplied.

LUMBER OPERATIONS NEARING NORMALCY

PORTLAND, July 18.—(AP)—More men were at work in the Pacific Northwest's lumber industry today than at any time since the beginning of the current strike May 6.

All mills were in operation at Tacoma, under National Guard protection. At Everett, 800 men began work in the Weyerhaeuser mill, bringing operations in that city to near normalcy. It was indicated that about 1000 more men went to work today in Everett, Grays Harbor, Tacoma, Seattle and Columbia river points.

No new disorders were reported. Yesterday passed quietly at all points, after sporadic outbreaks earlier in the week.
