## PLENTY OF FISH IN OREGON DIET

PORTLAND, July 19.—(AP)—Oregon's taste for fish proved surprising yesterday, even to those who conducted the survey to find out exactly how much of the native food was consumed.

Master Fish Warden M. T. Hoy announced that residents of this state eat fish on an average of twice a week, consuming 3.8 pounds each over a year's time. And the 3.8 pounds doesn't include any oysters or the 380,874 crabs listed as having been served during a recent 12-month period.

Still further evidence of the popularity of the gifts of sea and streams is evidenced in the much-heralded "record catches" by private fishermen, which cannot be included in a survey because they do not go through retail dealers among whom the investigation was made.

Salmon to the tune of 1,230,285 pounds was consumed in a year's time and the smelt consumption was listed as 903,247 pounds.
