against all priests who commented on political subjects from their pulpits yesterday did not take place.
The first factor is the fact that the man designated by Reichsfuehrer Hitler to handle religious affairs as a cabinet minister, Hand Kerrl, has left on a three weeks leave "to prepare himself for mastering the task with which he is charged by der Fuehrer."
This is interpreted in some church circles to mean that Kerrl will map a precise program for action in stifling the Catholic and Lutheran church opposition so that when he returns the blow will be all the harder.
The second delaying factor is the approaching conference of all Catholic bishops August 16 at Fulda. As the intervening time will be taken up in negotiations with Rome, the conference will announce a Catholic policy at about the same time Kerrl is expected to return to office and announce the Nazi policy.
