'Can Customers Take It?' Is Query Raised by Sub-Strato Flight Plans

By Howard W. Blackwell (Associated Press Service Editor) NEW YORK (AP)—Four "stratosphere" planes...

There is another problem, little discussed, the human one, or, as the aviation experts say, "the physiological limit."

The biggest difficulty comes at present in climbing to stratosphere heights, or anywhere near them.

Here again a limit appears. This is the power needed to compress the air. That limit is definite if engine power is used.

But by using the exhaust to run the supercharger this limit is lifted. Some engineers believe that as real stratosphere altitudes are approached...

Propeller designs will probably be changed with great altitudes. They will need considerably larger diameters of blades at 40,000 feet than at 4,000 feet.

In inside circles at present there is more discussion of the human problem than of the mechanical. The engineers can build the stratosphere planes, of that there is little doubt.
